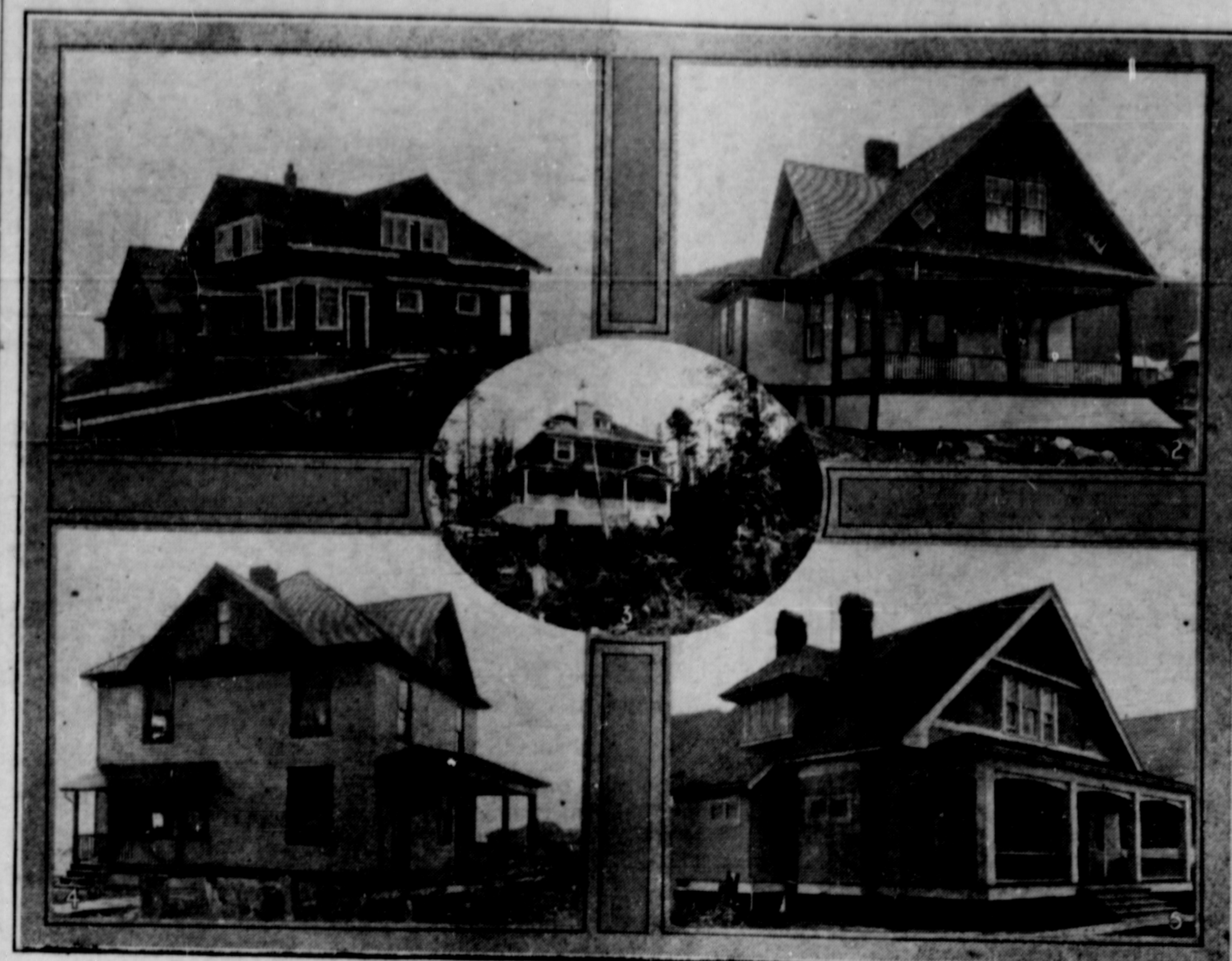

CANADA HAS INVITED CHURCHILL

Ottawa, Aug. 5.—It is stated in official circles here that pressing invitation has been extended to Hon. Winston Churchill, first lord of the admiralty, to visit Canada during the next session of the Canadian Parliament in order that he may lend the weight of his advice to the government in connection with Canada's temporary and permanent naval policy. Should Mr. Churchill consent to come it is improbable that he will arrive before January owing to the stress of work in the British House during November, when the home rule debate is expected to be at its hottest.

THRILLING SURGICAL WORK SUCCESSFUL

Hartford, Conn., Aug. 5.—By performing an unprecedented combination of operations, two lives were saved last night at St. Francis Hospital, and the surgeons confidently predict that Mrs. Josephine Lipton of Bloomfield and her twelve pound son will live. The main operation consisted of the Caesarian section. Before that, however, the hazardous resource of blood transfusion from the husband was necessary and again after the birth of the child a second infusion of life blood was deemed necessary.

TO ESTABLISH LOW RATE TO DULUTH

Ottawa, Aug. 5.—It is understood that in order to facilitate the shipment of the new western crop as much as possible the government will at an early date this autumn apply to the Interstate Commerce Commission for the rate on grain to Fort William and Duluth which was in force last spring, the rate being the same as that given by Canadian railways from Winnipeg to Fort William. The opening up of this route at an early date in the season, it is believed, will do much to prevent a recurrence of the serious and prolonged congestion of last season.

NORWAY'S MARINE STRIKE IS OVER

Norway has just come through a strike which at the start looked as though it would cause considerable trouble for Norwegian shipping. But although there were, during the few weeks that the strike lasted, of course, some delays, on the whole everything went off satisfactorily.

The Norwegian government very energetically stepped in and placed navy captains and engineers at the disposal of the most important companies on foreign and local routes, and the ship owners also to some extent hired foreign steamers. For shorter routes motor boats were employed to a large extent. The strike closed more quickly than anticipated and although the engineers obtained some of their demands, they retrenched considerably on their original demands during the negotiations.
