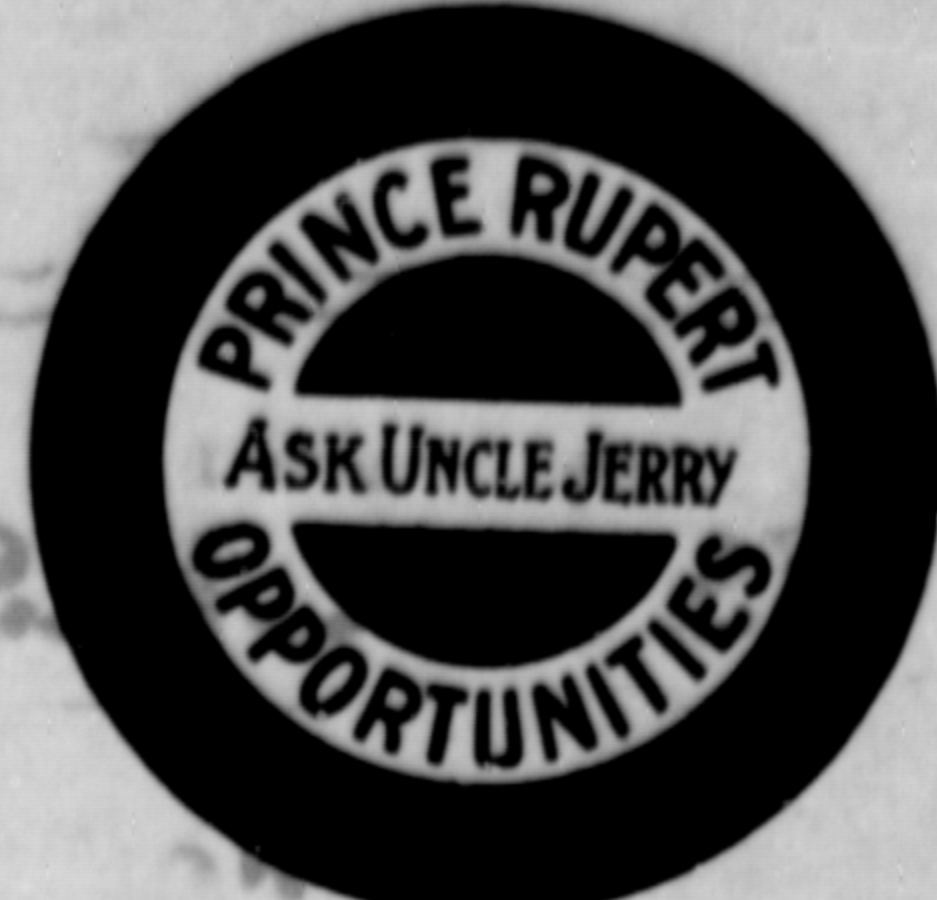

TYRUS COBB MAKES NOISE LIKE SOME MORE MONEY

Detroit, Aug. 10.—Ty Cobb today notified the Detroit club officials that his next demand for salary would be on the basis of \$15,000 a year instead of the paltry \$9,000 that he is now receiving. Cobb's present contract expires this fall and he is already making signs, meaning more money.

The present contract calls for \$9,000 a year for three years and if Cobb is injured in a game the

salary is to be continued, no matter how long he is useless to the club.

"I might as well get the money when I'm young," Cobb told President Navin. "When I'm old you will ship me to the minors just the same as you would anybody else. I do not think \$15,000 per year on a three years' contract is too much to ask, and you must consider that figure before considering me as a member of your team for 1913."

THIS STRIKE NOW ENDS IN COMPROMISE

Port Arthur, Aug. 13.—The employees of the Canadian Northern Coal and Ore Dock company return to work after a week's strike, featured by a riot on the first day in which six were injured and for which the militia was brought out. The new arrangement is a compromise by which the men get a raise averaging about two and a half cents an hour.

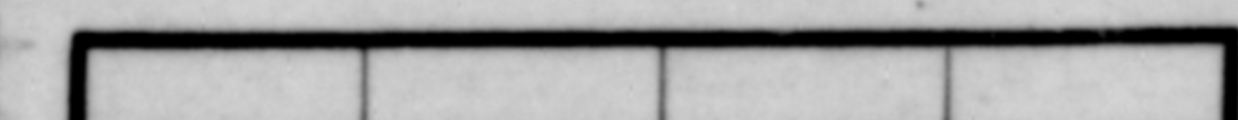
