TWELVE-YEAR-OLD INFANT WEIGHS BUT TWO POUNDS—THE MOTHER IS ONLY SIXTEEN YEARS OLD

Philadelphia, August 22.—His fingers are as big as toothpicks, his arms pass comfortably thru a woman's finger ring. He weighs two pounds, and he is twelve days old. Russell Bailey is Philadelphia's protegee for the world's runt honors. When he was born he weighed a pound and 11 ounces, but he is growing. He is now nine inches long, or rather tall. Physicians said he never

would live to become a ball player or a President, nor even to play marbles. But, in his bunk at the Infant Incubator Hospital at Point Breeze, young Bailey is persistently setting their predictions at naught. It seems that he will keep on growing and be a regular baby, for he drinks his milk as eagerly and as lustily as any other wee thing in the hospital. His mother is 16, and weighs less than 100 pounds.

MUNICIPAL FINANCING HAS BEEN DIFFICULT THIS YEAR

The pathway of municipal financing this year has been far from smooth. The congestion of the London market last fall has gradually become more acute until now it is impossible to float overseas a Canadian municipal or, for that matter, any low rate bond at any price. This fact has undoubtedly led many cities which refused early in the year to take expert advice, and accept what were then good offers to regret their shortsighted action.

In view of these facts, a great deal of temporary financing has been arranged. Only in a few cases have details been made public. Our banks know best what large aggregate loans are being carried by them for municipalities which await a turn

for the better in the London market. Of the numerous temporary loans made during the past six months the following have been tabulated by the Monetary Times:

Toronto, £1,200,000; one year bills, 4½ per cent.
Montreal, £75,000; six month, 4½ per cent.
Prince Rupert, £200,000; three year notes, 5 per cent.
Moosejaw, £266,748; treasury notes. (Negotiations still proceeding.)

Alberta (province), £1,500,000; six months treasury bills, 4½ per cent.
Quebec, £160,000; six months notes, 3½ per cent.
Victoria, £320,000; 3 15-16 to 4¼.

DO NOT THINK DAVIS HAD HAND IN ROBBERY OF BANK

Vancouver, Aug. 22.—That Walter Davis, arrested in Toronto, was a friend of Dean and McNamara, who are believed to have actually cracked the safe of the Bank of Montreal at Westminster, is the belief of Pinkerton Superintendent P. K. Ahearn of Vancouver. Davis and Powell, who are now fighting extradition in Detroit, are believed to be the men to whom a portion of the funds were turned over, but it is

not thought they had a hand in the actual robbery of the bank. There is no such evidence against them at present, though it is possible they were companions of McNamara and Dean at the time. Dean was called in the Westminster court this morning and remanded. There are a dozen witnesses on hand ready to testify that he was in Westminster at the time of the robbery. It is generally believed here that he will turn King's evidence.

CANAL EDMONTON TO THE PEG

Ottawa, Aug. 22.—It is stated in official circles that Engineer Voligny of the Department of Public Works, who has been in charge of the surveys for the proposed six foot barge canal from Edmonton to Winnipeg, is now at work on a final report and that an estimate of the proposed waterway will be in the hands of the government early this autumn. The expectation in official circles is that a vote will be placed in the estimates next session for the preliminary work. It is thought that the canal will cost several millions but the development of water power along the route may tend to reduce the cost somewhat.

MOTOR BOAT TURNS TURTLE AT SPEED

Chicago, Aug. 22.—Spectators witnessing a yacht race were given a thrill when the Reliance III, tuning up for the power boat events, overturned in the harbor while going about sixty-five miles an hour. Two men driving the speedy craft were thrown into the lake, but were rescued.

The Reliance III sank in thirty feet of water, and the chances of salvaging the craft are considered slight. It was valued at \$20,000.

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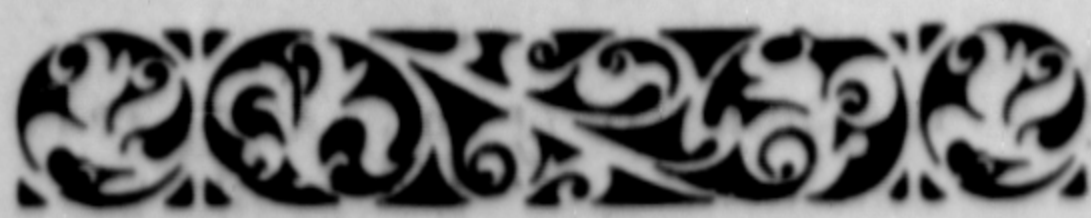
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
