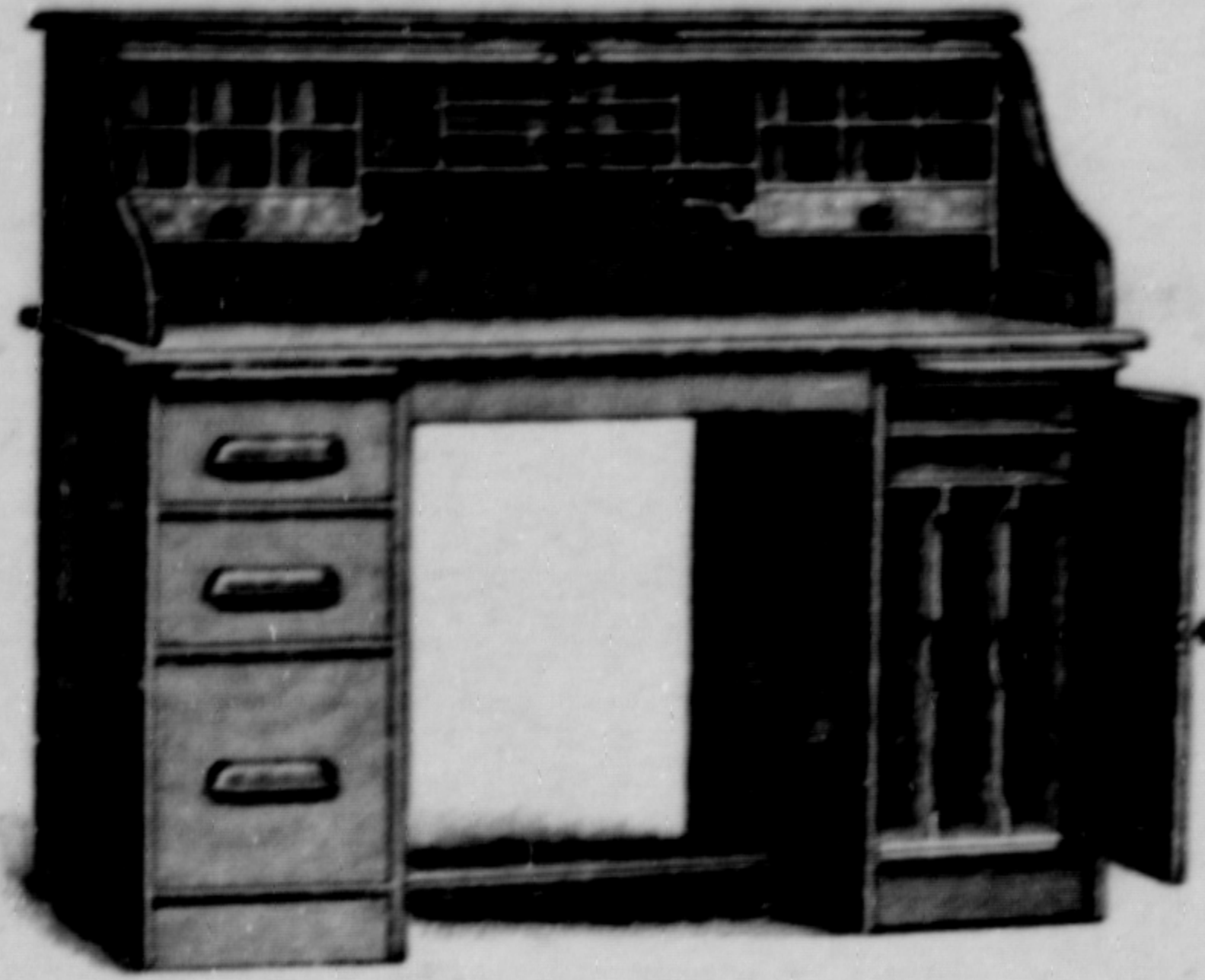

SHOULD BANK CLERKS MAKE BETS?

Toronto, Aug. 28.—Betting on the races is given as the cause of the wreckage of the careers of two Toronto bank clerks. Roland Harris, assistant clearing house teller of the Standard Bank, has to answer to the charge of misappropriating about \$7,000 from the bank's funds, while Richmond, paying teller of the Elm street branch of the Bank of Toronto, lies at death's door at St. Michael's Hospital following two attempts at suicide after he had stolen \$500 or more of the funds of the bank. According to the confessions of both tellers, they yielded to the temptation of placing large bets on "sure things" which did not fulfil expectations, and their efforts to recoup their losses were in vain.

END OF STRIFE IN SENATE

Washington, Aug. 27.—Sobered by embarrassments of Saturday's all-night session of filibustering and disagreements, Congress adjusted its differences today, and invited President Taft up to the Capitol once more. At 4.30 p.m. the end was marked with a return of harmony and an end filibustering.
