BRITISH COLUMBIA WINS THE GOLD MEDAL FOR PRODUCTS AGAINST OTHER PROVINCES

EUROPEAN NAVAL CONVENTION OF IMPORTANCE TAKES EFFECT SPEEDILY

Fighting Fleet of France to Guard the Mediterranean; Russia's Battleships the Baltic, While Britain's Navy Will Take Care of the North Sea

(Special to Daily News.)

Paris. Sept. 12.-The recently negotiated Franco-Russian naval convention and the older Anglo-French convention relating to the Mediterranean seaboard are to be brought into practical operation within a few days, when the French fleet, which has hitherto had headquarters at Brest, is to be permanently transferred to Toulon.

This naval move gives France complete control in the Mediterranean over any possible combination of the Triple Alliance, and will leave to England the defense of the North Sea, while Russia guards the Baltic Sea.

Experts point out that with the Russian fleet in the Baltic the strength of the British fleet will be materially increased against any contemplated German attck, while the English Channel is considered to be sufficiently defended by the numerous fleets of destroyers and submarines stationed on both the French and English coasts.
