### At the Theatre

Miss Verna Felton and the Allen Players Present "Zaza" with Success.

Belasco's famous "Zaza" was staged last night, for the first time in Prince Rupert. The Allen Players carried the play, and Miss Verna Felton took the lead. Tense and thrillingly dramatic scenes characterize this play, and there is work and to spare for the leading woman. Miss Felton filled the part with splendid effect, her realization of the tempestuous personality of Zaza thoroughly satisfying her audience, which thronged the pretty Westholme Opera House.

Like many dramas to which the term "masterpiece" is applied, the plot of Zaza is simple as an unhappy love story. A passionate, uneducated girl of genius as an actress, thinking to spurn love as a half-burnt cigarette, hurled herself into the very grip of the most violent abandonment of passion for a worthless wealthy brute. Zaza almost literally leaps into love with Bernard Dufresne. Man of the world merely, he takes every advantage of the girl's intense affection for him. He does not marry her. He is married already. She does not know, does not even dream that her idol is mud. So the old story works out to the inevitable bitter end of discovery and heart wrung distress for Zaza.

As for last night's presentation by the Allen Company, the work of the players one and all was conscientious, and the intensity of the strong passages was well upheld. Touches of humor brightly brought in furnished reaction after the tenser scenes. Mrs. P. R. Allen as Zaza's quaint old bibulous Aunt Rosa with her parrot-perch bonnet really achieved some artistic triumphs in interpretation of a distinctly human part. Mr. George Zucco, who played Bernard Dufresne, is an old timer almost in Rupert, having been here with at least two previously visiting stock companies, and his work last night in a role which well suited his powers was good. As Cascart, Mr. Raymond Ripley, in his most earnest passage, rather too faithfully "recited" his words. Otherwise, he acted well. As Toto, Miss Jean Patterson played the little girl part in manner to make the audience forget, except in passing flashes, the fact that Miss Patterson is out of the short frock stage of development. Alice Moore, in the care of Miss Etta Farnsworth was a good interpretation. Florianne as interpreted by Miss Gladys Hudars was effective. Others of the cast each filled his or her part satisfactorily.

Staging of the play was the best yet seen in Prince Rupert by any stock company. The first act was very well staged and the idea of a theatre scene within a theatre had its inevitable effect in interesting the audience. Last but not least, the work of the quaintly garbed Royal Hungarian orchestra was a source of real enjoyment to all interested in musical novelty with excellence. The Hungarian string orchestra with their pizzicato twittering tuneful instruments, playing all the favorite airs, old and new, will find friends in Prince Rupert.
