While it has been rumored for some time past that several Ottawa players, including Darragh, Shore, Taylor and Roman had agreed to come to the coast, Mr. Patrick declined to state that such was the case.

Quebec, holders of the Stanley cup, have sent a very tempting offer to Tommy Dunderdale, last year the leading goal getter of the Victoria team, and it is possible that Tommy will grab at the chance of getting on with the silverware custodians. Skinner Poulin and Newsy Lalonde, according to George Kennedy, will both be back in Montreal in time for the hockey season and both will figure on the line-up of the Canadiens.

When interviewed the other day Mr. Kennedy gave out the following, which will no doubt prove interesting to hockey followers on the coast:

"Skinner Poulin is liable to be back with his team this coming winter, as he has notified him that he intends to come East shortly and stay east."
"And as to Newsy Lalonde, he will be back here at the beginning of next month, and he is liable to stay back here. From what I have heard he is through with lacrosse on the coast, and he proposes to come and settle in the East again."

Although it was stated some time ago that New Westminster were to have an artificial rink of their own, nothing further seems to have been done in the matter and the time is getting late to erect one now.

Duluth, Oct. 3.—To help his father train for a sculling match with Jim Riley, James E. Heneyck, coach of the Duluth Boat Club, left for Syracuse.
