THE DREADED WAR IN EUROPE.

War has been declared by Montenegro against Turkey and Europe is involved in a struggle which may not end with the trouble in the Balkans, but which may terminate in a death duel between several of the greater powers.

For several months the greater nations of the world have been trying to negotiate a peaceable settlement of the Balkan troubles, and although last week it looked as if nothing could be done to keep the allied forces of the Balkan states from invading Turkey, renewed efforts on the part of the great

nations gave rise to the hope that the trouble might be amicably settled, but the sudden action of the principality in declaring war has quashed all hopes of arbitration.

The Sultan of Turkey is the head of the Mohammedan religion, and is considered to be the descendant of the prophet, and the result of the present trouble may be the signal for a religious war on the Christians by the fanatics of the East. Again, the friendly feeling between Germany and the Ottoman may be the spark that will kindle the long dreaded war between Great Britain and the German Empire.

NEWS NOTES OF INTEREST BY MAIL FROM THE OLD COUNTRY

William Cherry, a prisoner in Chelmsford jail, hanged himself in his cell on Sunday morning. He had served half his sentence of two years.

In recognition of a gallant attempt to rescue a boy who fell into the Stort at Bishop's Stortford, Herbert Hobday, a Great Eastern Railway porter, has been presented with a marble clock.

Lord Airlie, whose father was killed in South Africa, while commanding the Twelfth Lancers, has been appointed second lieutenant in the Tenth Hussars, in which regiment his father was once adjutant.

Between July 29 and August 25, 404,046 persons passed the turnstiles at the Wellington pier and garden, Great Yarmouth, an increase of 11,101 on the corresponding period of last year.

Mr. Alfred Sutro, Mr. F. E. Smith, K.C., M.P., and Sir W. M. Aiten, M.P., were among the passengers who landed at Fishguard from the Mauretania, which arrived from New York.

The King sent fruit and flowers from the gardens at Windsor to the harvest services held at the King Edward institution, Spitalfields, and the fruit will be given to the poor families in East London.

A hunter bearing his master's riding boots, hunting cap and crop led the procession at the funeral of Mr. Nap Page, a

Southdown farmer and a keen hunting man, at Edburton, Sussex.

A young girl who had swallowed a brooch has been cured at St Barthomew's hospital after an operation.

Henry Butcher, for about forty years verger of St. Paul's church in Tunbridge Wells, was found dead in the church recently.

Earl Manvers has notified his tenants that he intends to dispose of over 8,000 acres of his estates in Northeast Derbyshire by auction.

A member of the crew of the Red Star liner Lapland was killed by a winch recently while the liner was landing passengers at Dover.

Applying for an ejection order at Brentford, a house agent said that in one six-room house in Isleworth forty people were living.

While grinding "drift" at an emery wheel at Stanningley Iron Works, Leeds, a workman named William Phillips was killed by the wheel bursting.

The local government board has sanctioned the erection, under the housing act, of twenty-four cottages at Twyford, Bucks, where dwellings are scarce.
