## MINING NOTES OF THE CANAL

The annual general meeting of the Red Cliff company is to be held in Vancouver on the 31st inst. Locally no information is obtainable in regard to when the big mine will resume development or of the proposed New English company to take over the same in conjunction with the operation of a smelter plant. Several of the directors have been in the Old Country in connection with the deal, and those posted seem sanguine that the new undertaking will be successfully launched.

It is reported from the Northern Terminus that good ore is being encountered in the face of the drifts being run from the 50 foot level in the shaft. A considerable quantity of high grade silver ore has already been sacked.

The main cross tunnel in the Red Reef is now in a distance of over 110 feet.

Foreman Pat Daley of the Salmon-Bear River is crosscutting to the ore body in the lower tunnel.

The drift in the Indian Mines is in a full face of the ore carrying galena and gold. A splendid feature of the ore is the very persistent gold values to be had, averaging around \$10 per ton. It is understood the mine will be operated all winter with an increased force.

Supplies are being taken in to the Cascade Falls, wood stacked and the camp put in shape to work throughout the winter.

Harry P. Gibson and Pete Ronn own the Gibson group of six claims across the railway track from the townsite of Bitter Creek and about 1,000 feet above the railway. They purpose developing throughout the winter and have already driven a 15 foot prospect tunnel besides some 30 feet of open cut. The vein, which measures some six feet, carries good values in gold, silver and copper.

Pack horses were taken over to the Marmot River by Bruggy and McGee, who purpose sending out a trial shipment of high grade silver and gold ore from the Montana group.

Grant Mahood is still continuing work on the Daly group, which consists principally of open cuts following the crouse of the ore.

Prince Rupert's Reception to the Duke, as Reported in the London Mirror.

The following from the Daily Mirror is what the press representatives thought of sufficient importance to cable London from Prince Rupert.

Prince Rupert (British Columbia), Sept. 24.—The special steamer Princess Alice, with the Duke of Connaught and his party on board, arrived here yesterday after a most enjoyable voyage, which allowed the royal travellers to admire the highly picturesque coast line and the maze of islands on the route.

The party drove around the town, the main street of which is constructed of planks, and the Duke afterwards took lunch with the Canadian club. An Indian brass band concert also figured in the royal programme.

Mrs. Stork, whose husband was in command of the guard of honor yesterday, has given birth to a daughter. The child is to receive the name of Patricia, in honor of the Princess.

## RE VOTERS' LIST.

I am instructed by the City Council to publish the following notice with regard to voting at the next municipal election. The persons who will be inserted on the voters' list are as follows:

1. Owners of real estate: This means any person who has a deed of land registered in the Land Registry Office or an agreement for purchase of land registered in the Registry Office.

2. Any person holding a trade license may vote before doing so he must, in October, make a declaration showing his right to vote in Form 1. These forms can be obtained at the City Clerk's office. The declaration must be filed with the City Clerk within forty-eight hours after it is made.

3. Any householder can vote. A householder means a person who has resided in Prince Rupert from the 1st of January, 1912, and who occupies a dwelling, tenement, hotel or boarding house, or any portion of a dwelling house, tenement, hotel or boarding house. He must also pay rates, taxes or assessments which are not chargeable on land, and which rates, taxes and assessments so paid amount to not less than \$2.00. Water rates and dog licenses do not count. Practically the only tax that can be paid is the road tax, \$2.00, and any person who, being a householder as above described, has already paid his road tax must also make a declaration before he can be placed on the voters' list.

All voters must be 21 years of age and British subjects.
