BULKLEY GETS
REDUCE RATE

G. T. P. to Give Farmers Opportunity to Compete Successfully with Imported Produce.

The farmers of the Skeena and Hazelton districts are now getting after the G. T. P. Railway for better rates on farm produce to Prince Rupert. It appears that such things as potatoes can be brought from Ashcroft to Rupert for less money than from along the Skeena. This puts the local farmers to a disadvantage. The matter has been pointed out to General Agent McMaster and he has promised to take it up with headquarters. Mr. McMaster recognized the stand taken by the Skeena farmer and there is every reason to believe that a better rate will shortly be provided. There is no doubt but that the Skeena, Hazelton and Kispisio farmers can at the present time supply Prince Rupert with all the produce required and there is no reason why anything should be brought from Ashcroft or from the South. The quality of the local stuff has also been proven equal in everything and superior in many. It is now up to all the farmers to get busy and send their views to Mr. McMaster and keep at it until they are given a better rate to enable them to compete with outside produce.—Omineca Herald.

NEW FEATURES
ON IRON DUKE

British Dreadnaught Recently Launched Has Many New Features Including Three Skins

London, Nov. 11.—The launching of the Iron Duke at Portsmouth marks a new era in British naval construction. The vessel is the twenty-eighth British Dreadnaught to take the water. Her displacement is 26,000 tons and her main battery consists of 13.5 inch guns firing shells of 1,000 pounds, or 150 pounds more than the projectiles fired by former weapons of this calibre.

The chief feature, however, of the new Dreadnaught is the improvement that she demonstrates in protection against submarine attacks. Over the whole length of her "vitals" (from the first turret to the last) the hull of the ship consists of three separate skins, so that even if the two outer ones should be pierced with rocks or torpedoes the stability of the vessel would not be impaired. These skins are of different thicknesses of steel and are backed at the most exposed parts. At certain parts the space between is sufficient to enable men to descend and repair them.
