## ACCUSED OF STEALING A VALUABLE DIAMOND

Ned Williams Sent up for Trial  
After Telling Remarkable Story

With a story of accidentally finding a valuable diamond ring valued at between \$150 and \$200 and leaving it with the bartender at the Knox Hotel as security for a temporary loan of a \$2 bill, Ned Williams found himself in the police court this morning upon a charge of theft.

The prisoner, together with one or two companions, had been drinking. They were all stopping at the Victoria Hotel.

Al. Goodwin, a miner, together with his chum, on last Wednesday night occupied a room together. As was his custom before retiring he placed a gun together with a wallet containing \$7.00 under his pillow. Upon awakening in the morning he found the gun and the empty wallet under the bed, and a ring which had been upon his finger gone.

The story was soon around and reached the ears of the night bartender of the Knox Hotel. Between 6 and 7 o'clock that morning the accused had handed a ring to the bartender in question asking for the loan of two dollars, and obtained that sum. Accused was shortly afterwards arrested. His story was that between 6 and 7 o'clock that morning on going in his stocking feet to the basement, trod upon a hard object. He looked down and saw nothing on the ground. Further investigation discovered, under the carpet, the ring in question.
