

TAKE PRECAUTIONS TO ENSURE FAMILY WRISTMAS TREE SAFE

The Christmas tree, long a festive symbol to people throughout the world, can become an instrument of death and injury unless careful precautions are taken, warns the All Canada Insurance Federation.

Officials of the federation said Christmas trees were definite fire hazards and should be chosen and used with extreme caution.

In addition, care should be taken in the buying of Christmas presents and decorations. Chemistry sets, firearms and toys requiring kerosene or other inflamable liquids should not be given to young children. As a final safeguard, use of these toys should be supervised by adults.

To help minimize the danger of fire and accidents during the Christmas season, safety experts recommended the following precaution;

. Choose a small tree; it is less hazardous than a large

2. Keep trees outdoors as long as possible; remove from the house when needles start to fall.

3. Never place trees near doorways, staircases or fireplaces. 4. The safest foundation for a Christmas tree is a pot of water.

5. Keep burning eigarettes, eigars and portable heaters heaters away from tree.

. Christmas presents should not be placed under tree until Christmas Eve; fancy wrappings should be removed as soon as possible.

i. Use electric lights for tree decorations, never candles. 8. When lights dry out tree needles, rearrange lights.

9. Be sure that electrical decorations do not overload cir-

10. Decorative lights should be turned off when house is

unoccupied. 11. Avoid the use of gauge-like cloth for children's party

12. When stoves are being used heavily, avoid accumula-

tion of grease in ovens and burners.
