### STILL THE COST OF LIVING GOES HIGHER

Government Reports for November Indicates that Cost of Living is on Increase

Ottawa, Dec. 18-An increased cost of living is again indicated in the report of the labor department for November. The department's index number of wholesale prices rose approximately one point, standing at 134.2 as compared with 133.1 in October. and 129.4 in November 1911.

The advance was due chiefly to higher prices for fish, textiles, hides and leather, fuel and | lighting, while Ontario grains, dairy produce, metals lumber and miscellaneous building materials were slightly upward, with Western grains, cattle and
