COAST TO COAST MOTOR BOAT RUN

Race Will Be from New York to San Francisco via Panama Canal.

San Francisco, Jan. 8.—New York to San Francisco via the Panama Canal in November, 1914, is the latest motor boat race on the calendar. I. H. Corey, of the San Francisco Yacht Club motor boat committee, one of the most prominent members of the "local section" of the American Power Boat Association, received a letter from Morris Whitaker, secretary of the governing body of motor boat owners in New York, stating that the Power Boat Association was organizing a long distance race through the canal for 1914, in which motor boats from all over the country are invited to participate.

This race will be the longest motor boat event ever tried in any part of the world. The boats are scheduled to leave New York in November and will make their way to this city via the canal. The only authorized stopping place will be San Diego.

The race is more of an endurance test for engines and boats.
