SIX PERSONS KILLED

Stones Premier and Demands Resignation of Ministers-Police Patrol Streets

(Special to The Daily News.) Tokio, Japan, Feb. 10-Six persons were killed and sixtyfive injured in political riots ill here today. The situation is serious. Prince Hatsura, premier of Japan, was stoned by a mob who demanded the resignation of his ministry. The mobi burned and wrecked police stations, tram cars and private buildings. Troops patrol the streets tonight while the homes of the ministers are threatened The people generally resent the efforts of Hatsura to stifle the opposition to his ministry.

IN JAPANESE RIOTS LONDON STOCK EXCHANGE HAS FAITH IN PRINCE RUPERT

PROMINENT MEMBERS ARE ACQUIRING SUBSTANTIAL IN-TERESTS IN LAND HERE AFTER MAKING CAREFUL ENQUIRIES.

In view of the important railway developments which are expected to be completed by the close of next year, it is worthy of note that prominent members of the London Stock Exchange are acquiring substantial land interests at Prince Rupert. This has only been done after very careful enquiries, and bearing in mind the extreme caution usually employed by the "house" man in making his investments it may be taken as indicating great faith in Prince Rupert's future. — London Financial News.
