

KNIGHTS OF PYTHIAS CELEBRATE ANNIVERSARY

McLeod, the minister of the church preached an eloquent and appropriate sermon for the occasion taking his text from Matthew V Chapter and 41st verse, "And whosoever shall compel thee to go one mile, go with him twain." Remarking that this text was practically a synopsis of the sermon on the Mount, the preacher brought forth most ably the duty of the Christian man toward his fellow. In all the different spheres of our activities, in the ordinary routine

of our daily work whether as employer or employee, the great principle involved in this text was brought forth. The man who was only willing to go just as far as he was actually enforced by his obligations, had not the true and broad spirit that was inculcated in the hearts of mankind by our Savior over two thousand years ago. ELOQUENT SERMON ON POLAR TRAGEDY

Bishop Du Vernet Dealt with the Lessons to Be Learned from Capt. Scott's Heroic Death.

Last evening at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church the Rt. Rev. Bishop Du Vernet preached to a crowded congregation a most eloquent and inspiring sermon taking for his subject the story of the terrible tragedy of the late Antarctic expedition that ended so disastrously with the death through starvation and exposure of Captain Robert Scott and his little band of heroic followers. After dwelling on the lessons that were to be learnt, from the self denying and noble actions of men of this stamp, who willingly gave up their lives in the service of their fellowman in the pursuit of scientific research, His Reverence concluded by impressing upon his hearers the duty of never forgetting the grand message left for his countrymen by Captain Scott just before he died. "That Englishmen today could face hardship carrying in its trail death if necessary, with all the fortitude and endurance of their ancestors of old down the long line of the generations that have passed."
