## ADEQUATE DEFENSE OF PACIFIC SUBJECT OF CONSIDERATION

PREMIER OF AUSTRALIA WILL MAKE EFFORT TO HAVE CAN. ADA FALL IN LINE WITH SISTER COLONIES.

Melbourne, Feb. 27.—With the approach of May political campaigns are commencing throughout Australia with great vigor, and a determined effort is being made by the Labor party to again occupy the federal benches, while an equally determined attempt will be put forward by the Liberals to oust their opponents from the coveted seats.

Free trade and protection, it now appears, are to be the principal policies on which the opposing parties will appeal to the country for support during the general federal elections.

The Melbourne Age is at present running a series of articles demonstrating that Australia is losing millions of pounds annually in wages owing to the defects in the present tariff.

The paper is making an urgent appeal to the Liberal party to reject all free trade proposals, and to help Australian industry by encouraging a strong tariff.

On account of the fact that the

recently elected Liberal leader, Mr. Joseph Cook, is a noted free trader, Labor ranks are justifiably believing that their party will be returned by an overwhelming majority.

The present Labor government, while promising to increase the present protection, also has determined on a vigorous defense policy. The government promises that the compulsory military service will be continued and that the building of the Australian navy will not be neglected.

The prime minister, Mr. Andrew Fisher, intends to make an effort to discuss the adequate defense of the Pacific with Mr. George E. Foster when he arrives, since Australia has not given up hope that Canada will fall in line with New Zealand and the commonwealth in this respect.

Altogether an interesting campaign is promised, with the odds in favor of a return of the government.

## PIRATES WERE BEATEN BY BROTHERHOOD CUBS

THE MOST EXCITING GAME IN THE SERIES WAS PLAYED LAST NIGHT—PIRATES AND CUBS NOW STAND EQUAL CHANCES.

By the handsome margin of 19 points to 9 with an innings to spare the Brotherhood Cubs defeated the Pirates last evening, at the Indoor Baseball league game played at the Skating Rink on 6th Avenue. This puts the Cubs a tie with the Pirates for first place up to the present. The match, which was of a very exciting character, was witnessed by a large crowd of spectators, there being nearly a hundred paid admissions, besides the regular season ticket holders who number about fifty. The Pirates who, until their defeat last night had had an unbroken series of victories to their credit, were somewhat surprised to have the Brotherhood Cubs put it over them to the tune of ten runs last evening, of course amongst the evening. Much delight was occasioned by the unexpected victory of the latter.

Many of those present last evening, who have been regular attendants at the matches since the game was first started in the city, some three years ago, consider that it was the best match so far pulled off. For the victors, W. D. Vance pitched a remarkably fine game, fairly astonishing his many admirers. Weber at 3rd, was particularly conspicuous by his many fine plays, as was also Reeves a new man on the Brotherhood team. "Doc" Evans for the Pirates was one of the stars of the vanquished team, whilst Fred Henning played his usual cool and consistent game. Gaining a lead right at the start the Brotherhood rose to the occasion and went straight ahead, never looking back until victory of the above substantial character crowned their efforts.
