#### TO STIMULATE COTTON GROWING IN THE SUDAN

British Parliament Guarantees a Sudan Loan for Fifteen Million Dollars.

London, May 2.—Protection for the cotton trade of Lancashire by fostering the supply of cotton independent of America was the gist of Chancellor Lloyd-George's argument in introducing in the house of commons this evening a resolution permitting the British government to guarantee a Sudan loan of \$15,000,000 for the development of cotton growing along the Nile.

The chancellor remarked that owing to difficulties with regard to supplies of American cotton, arising from the market being cornered and thus causing a shortage here despite abundant crops, made it necessary to foster the growth of cotton where it would be under British control. Egyptian cotton, he claimed, was better from the point of view of the manufacturer and the quality of the goods obtained from that product, and also from the point of view of the workmen, because it was cleaner and healthier to work than was American cotton. The resolution was adopted without division.

#### FORTIETH ANNUAL CHARITY MEETING

Distinguished Speakers on Sociological, Philanthropic and Public Affairs to Attend

Seattle, Wash., May 6—Announcement has just been made of the committees for the entertainment of the National Conference of Charities and Correction which meets in this city on July 5th to 12th. Mayor Geo. F. Cotterill is Honorary President, and Rev. Sydney Strong president of the executive committee.

The national conference this year, which will be the fortieth annual meeting, will without doubt be the largest in point of attendance and of the widest general interest of any thus far held. It is already known that Graham Taylor, Edward T. Devine, Jane Adams, John M. Glenn, Judge Ben Lindsay, Governor West and others of prominence in sociological, philanthropic and public affairs will discuss most important subjects before the convention.

**High Rentals in Regina**

The scheme was first suggested by Alderman Halleron. The city owns considerable property, including about half a section or so within three-quarters of a mile of the post office. Ald.
