### CHILD THOUGHT DEAD ARISES FROM COFFIN

Grandmother Fell Dead as Newly Arisen Boy Gazed Into Her Eyes.

Butte, Cal., May 3.—Silently bowed about the little coffin of their 3-year-old son, Mrs. J. R. Burney and relatives, of this city, were listening to the funeral services, when there was a slight movement within the coffin. Slowly the form of the child, clad in its white shroud, rose to a sitting posture and gazed about the room.

The minister ceased his solemn words and the little boy, a moment before seemingly dead, looked into the eyes of Mrs. L. P. Smith, his grandmother, 81 years old.

Shocked at the sight, the aged woman fell back in her chair dead. As the eyes of the others turned to the woman as she expired, the child sank back into the coffin. Its mother immediately grasped it in her arms. A physician was summoned, but the aged woman was dead, and the little boy was dying. This afternoon there were two coffins in the Burney home. Double services were held and the little child and his aged grandmother were laid side by side in the family plot.
