### BORDEN AND LAURIER AVIATION IN WAR

SEEMS A FAILURE Amid such slaughter as is still going on in the Balkans, the killing of one aviator attracts attention only because the use of aeroplanes in war is still a novelty, picturesque and full of possibilities that loom the larger because the imagination, not knowledge, defines them.

In Tripoli aerial scouts have done a little-a very littledamage to the enemy, and they have on a few occasions secured information of some value to the Italian commanders. But war there remained just about what it has always been between such antagonists in such conditions. Certainly it was not "revolutionized" by the new military utensil.

In the Balkans several of the opposing forces have been supplied, though meagerly, with aeroplanes, and we hear only that the Turks at Adrianople succeeded in bringing down one of the Servian aviators by the use of shrapnel. This is informative, though not encouraging, and not confirmative of the confident prophecies that the aeroplane would make war of the old sort im-

possible. This particular war, so far, has been lamentably little different from those of the period when firearms first replaced bows and swords. Hand-tohand conflicts have been many and the slaughter on both sides enormous. The fighting has been as old-fashioned as the motives for fighting-religious hate and the desire to extend boundaries.


