HOCH! DER KAISER HIS JUBILEE

Yesterday was the twentyfifth anniversary of the accession of Emperor William to the throne of Germany, and the record of this twenty-five years of the empire under his rule has been vastly different from the general expectations of what it would be at the time of his accession.

For the accession of the young emperor caused serious apprehension in every chancellery of Europe. He was looked upon as a headstrong young man, filled with military spirit and intensely desirous of extending the power of Germany by means of the splendid army of which he had inherited the supreme command. All through the earlier years of his reign the same forebodings were felt, and almost every public utterance of the emperor tended to prove there was sound reason for these forebodings. He rejoiced in the title of "war lord," and never failed to use it as descriptive of the place he held in the German Empire.

Yet the German Empire has never fired a shot in actual! warfare during his entire reign. Russia has engaged in one great war, which cost it terribly in prestige, in life and in treasure; England has had a costly "little war" in its conquest of the Boers; Spain, in its brief war with the United States, lost the last of its colonial possessions: Italy has grappled with the Turk and acquired a claim of title to Tripoli, and is still using an army to enforce its authority






