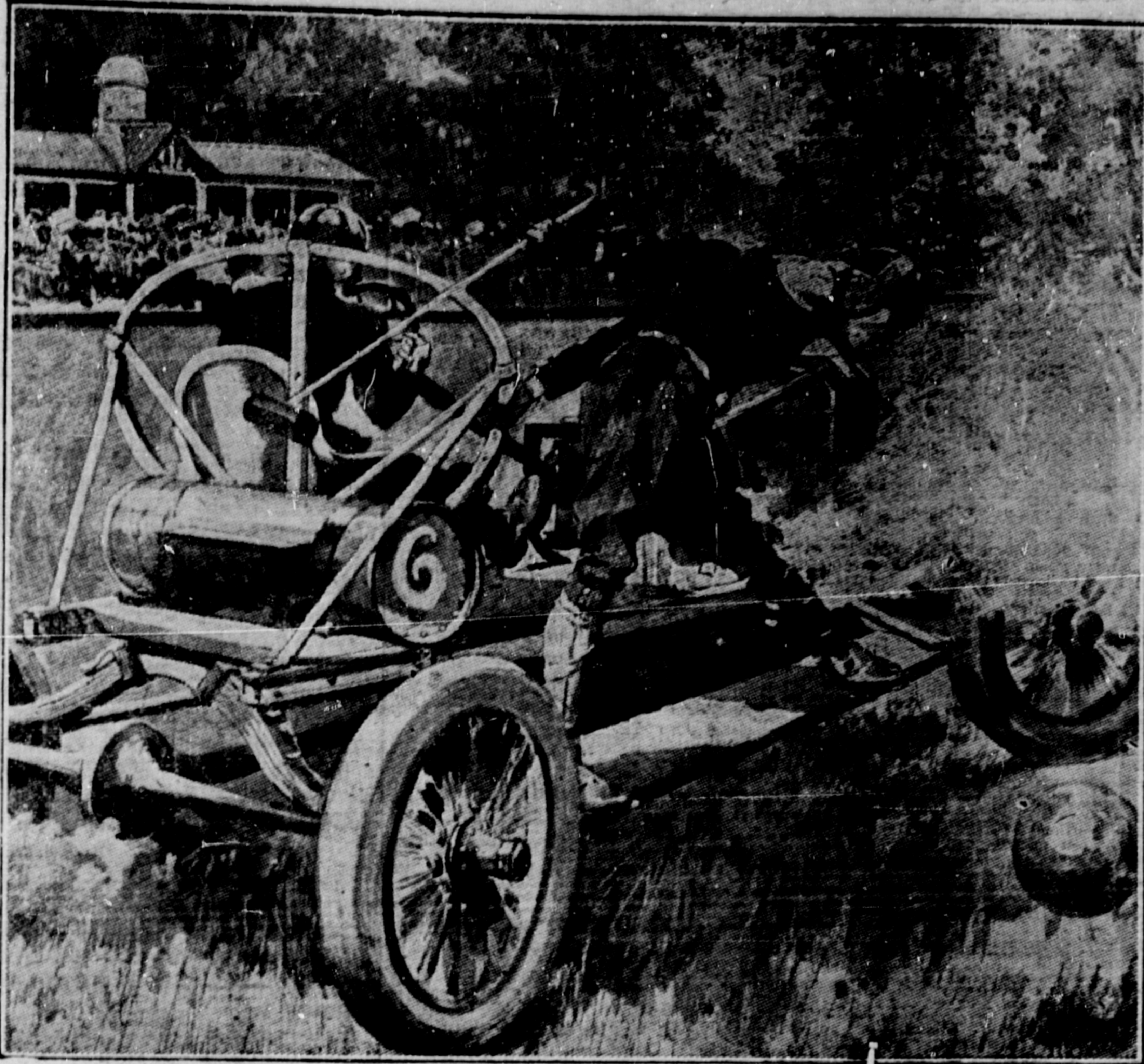

KING'S BENCH RULES AGAINST WHITE STAR
What is Printed on Steamship Ticket Refusing Liability is Declared Illegal.

London, June 30.—The condition printed on the steamship tickets issued by the White Star Line exempting that company from liabilities for loss by a passenger even through negligence of the company's servants is illegal, according to a judgment pronounced today by Sir Clement M. Bailhache, justice of the King's bench division of the high court of justice.
