The Royal Commission appointed under the provisions of the "Public Inquiries Act" to inquire into the under-mentioned matters respecting coal mined in British Columbia, viz:
The cost of production;
The cost of transportation;
The cost of production;
The cost to dealers in the province;
The cost to dealers outside the province;
The cost to consumers in the province;
The cost to consumers outside the province;
The profits made by persons or corporations controlling or owning coal mines in the province;
The profits made by dealers in coal;

The alleged shortage of coal for consumption within the province, and, if such shortage be found to exist or to have existed within the past five years, the cause or causes thereof, and whether and to what extent, such shortage is due to the shipment out of the province of coal mined in the province;
And generally to inquire into all matters relating to or affecting the price of coal in the province, will hold its first sittings in the city of Prince Rupert, in the courthouse, on Wednesday and Thursday, July 9 and 10, commencing at 2 o'clock Wednesday afternoon.

The above sittings will be confined to the cost to consumers and as to the alleged shortage of coal, and generally as to any question from the consumer's point of view.

Anybody desiring to give evidence before the commission on behalf of consumers, or having any information from said point of view is hereby requested to appear at the above sittings.
