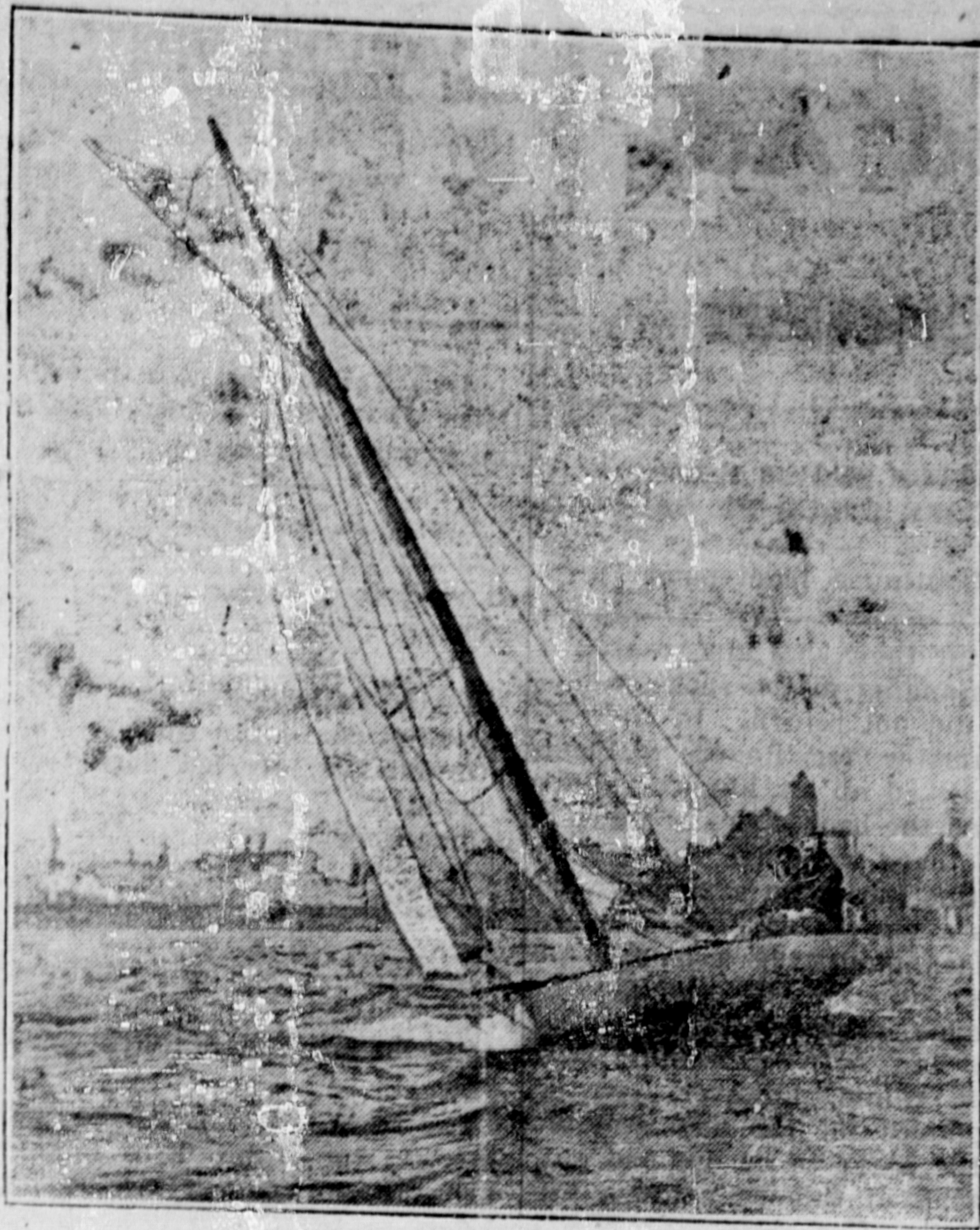

## VANCOUVER WILL NEVER AGAIN PLAY WITH SALMONBELLIES

EMPHATIC DECLARATION OF PRESIDENT CON JONES OF THE VANCOUVER CLUB—CONTEMPTUOUS OF PUBLIC RIGHTS SALMONBELLIES WALK OFF FIELD

Barney Goss writes in the Vancouver World a spirited account of last Saturday's game of lacrosse, which to everyone's disappointment proved to be no game at all. There are many lacrosse players in Prince Rupert and they have been anxiously telephoning the News for a report of this game, in regard to which there was not a word in our telegraphic despatches. Barney Goss writes:

With a contemptuous disregard for the rights of the public, the Westminister Salmonbellies, in the presence of some 3,500 spectators gathered to witness a lacrosse contest, walked off the field at Hastings Park on Saturday afternoon, and refused to play a regularly scheduled game in the series between Vancouver and Westminister in the British Columbia Lacrosse Association.

The action of the Salmonbellies was based on the proceedings of an alleged meeting of the British Columbia Lacrosse Association held at New Westminister on Friday afternoon last. At that meeting there was present no one entitled to any official recognition except members of the Westminister Lacrosse Club. There most certainly was not present a legal quorum for the transaction of any business. Victoria was not represented; neither was Vancouver. Despite the irregularity of the action, however, the minority Westminister delegation constituted themselves the governing power in the association and proceeded to transact business in its name. One order of business taken up by the one-horse meeting was the consideration of a report of Referee Bob Dewar, who officiated in the game played in Victoria on Saturday, June 28, in which Dewar stated that players Ion and Griffith were guilty of unsportsmanlike actions in that game. Taking advantage of the opportunity here presented of weakening the Vancouver team so as to make a defeat for the Salmonbellies impossible, the Westminister delegates placed a

suspension of one game on the players, the suspension to be effective on Saturday last.

When Referee Fred Cullin was about to face the ball for play, Tommy Gifford, manager of the Westminister team, delivered an ultimatum that if Ion and Griffith lined up with Vancouver, the Salmonbellies would not play the game. Con Jones was equally determined that the Greenshirts should not be weakened through the illegal action of the Westminister delegates at the meeting on Friday, and absolutely refused to put substitutes in action in their places.

Thereupon, led by Manager Tommy Gifford and certain of the Westminister players paraded off the field.

### FORTUNES IN FISHING

What Twenty Days' Work Off Langara Realized.

Henry White, one of the Masset fishermen off Langara Island, was here recently and reported that he obtained 8,000 pounds of spring salmon during twenty days' fishing. At the rate of 4 cents per pound, White's return will be \$320 for the twenty days' fishing. This means that hundreds of fishermen are turning in hundreds of thousands of pounds of fish to the three companies engaged in shipping the large salmon.

### VERY NEAR A TRAGEDY

Another of Those Near Drownings Reported from Seal Cove.

Ole Crosby started from Seal Cove as captain of the gasoline launch Rainbow, shipping Walter Talbot as chief engineer. When some distance out the boat ran on a rock and Ole jumped overboard to push her off. But Walter thought it was a clear case of attempted suicide, owing to the fact that he was not showing because he lost his job. When he jumped to the rescue, Ole laughed and it seems unlikely that Walter will get a Carnegie medal for bravery.

### LADY SACKVILLE UPHELD

Gets the Five Millions Left Her by Sir Murray Scott

London, July 7.—The will of the late Sir John Murray Scott, leaving nearly £5,000,000 to Lady Sackville, daughter of the former British Minister to Washington, was sustained today by the jury which heard the evidence in the contest brought by Sir John's relatives. The jury found no undue influence or fraud on the part of Lady Sackville.

### SENATOR CONVICTED

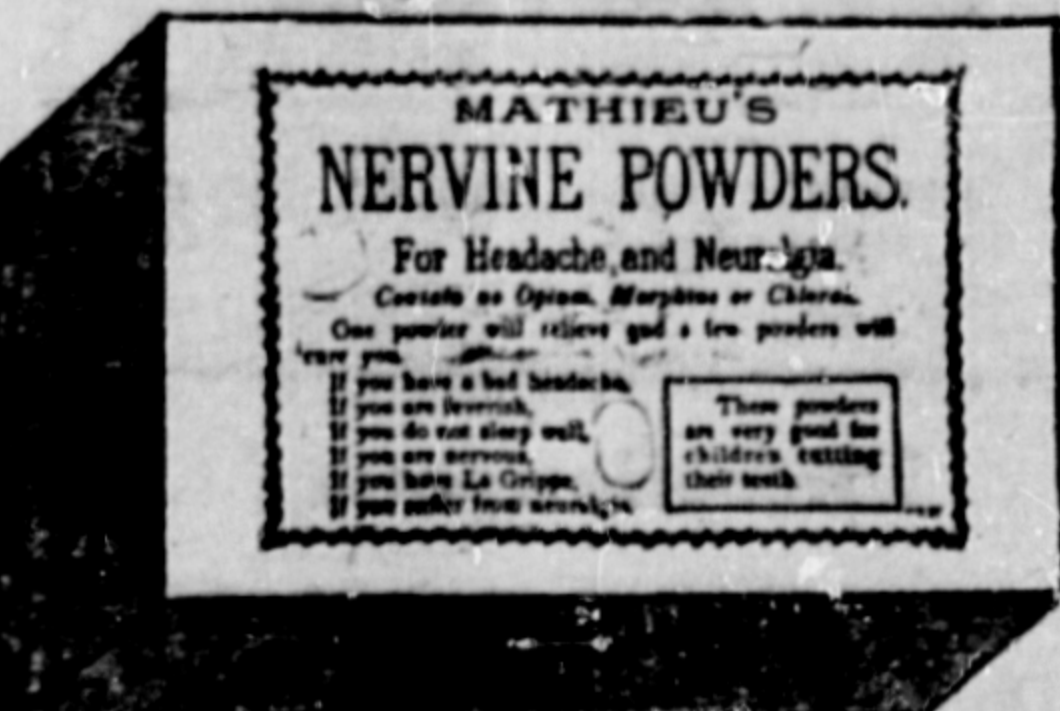
Smith, of West Virginia, Guilty of Accepting Bribe
