NO WOMEN LAWYERS IN ENGLAND FOR PRESENT

Miss Webb Has Entirely Failed in Her Action Against the Law Society.

London, July 12.—There will be no women solicitors in England at any rate for the present, Miss Webb having failed in her action against the Law Society. Justice Joyce, giving judgment today, said he did not doubt that before the legislation of 1843 women were disqualified by sex from becoming or practicing as solicitors or attorneys. There was no indication in subsequent legislation of any intention to alter the law on that point, and he was certain there was no intention of the legislature to do so.

Becker Trial Refused.

New York, July 12.—Charles Becker's application for a new trial on the charge of murdering the gambler Herman Rosenthal was denied today by Supreme Court Justice Goff. If relief comes to Becker now it must be through the higher courts. For months he has been in the death cell at Sing Sing.

Redmond Barry Dead.

London, July 12.—The Right Hon. Redmond Barry, lord chancellor of Ireland, died last night. Redmond Barry was born in 1866. He was solicitor general of Ireland from 1905-1909 and attorney general from 1909-1911.

JACK JOHNSON HAS ARRIVED IN PARIS

French Authorities Have Not Yet Decided Whether to Deport Him or Not.

Paris, July 14.—Jack Johnson, negro heavyweight prize fighter, accompanied by his wife and his nephew, arrived today in Paris. The pugilist drove to several hotels before he was able to find accommodation.

Johnson said he intended to make Paris his headquarters in the future, and that never on any account would he fight again in America. He added that he had arranged for several fights to take place in Europe in the autumn.

It is not generally believed here that Johnson will be deported from France, but the French authorities have not yet arrived at any permanent decision with regard to that status of the case.

PEOPLE WHO LIVE IN GLASS HOUSES

The joke has turned on the reporter for an evening paper which a couple of days ago poked some fun at the staff of one of its contemporaries who for several days were puzzled to discover the cause of most unpleasant odors in the office which turned out to be from decomposing fish caught by the office boy and hidden away by rats. The reporter, accompanied by another member of the staff, went fishing on a recent Sunday and during the day got some salmon eggs which they deposited in their pockets. On their return home they forgot to remove the eggs and for the last three or four days have been sniffing and wondering what caused the sniff. Things got so bad that a thorough investigation revealed the cause, the decaying eggs left in the pockets of their fishing coats.

Big Sum for Minnesota.

St. Paul, Minn., July 12.—The state will collect approximately \$154,000 in costs from the Northern Pacific and Great Northern Railways as the result of the United States Supreme Court decision in the Minnesota rate case.

TERMINUS OF NEW LINE

Saskatoon Becomes Terminal of C. P. R. Line from Calgary.

(Special to The Daily News.)

Saskatoon, July 17.—Saskatoon is about to become the terminus for a direct line from this city to Calgary via Milden and Empress to be built by the C. P. R. A despatch has been received to the effect that this route has been entered on the new C. P. R. maps just issued at Ottawa.

The new line of the C. P. R. will mean the tapping of a large territory south and west of Saskatchewan, both in Saskatchewan and Alberta, and will increase the distributing territory of this city to a large extent. In addition to this it will mean that Saskatoon will become the grain centre for a large territory of land which heretofore has been depending upon other cities on the main line of the C. P. R. and C. N. R. Construction work on the new proposed line will be started next year.

Municipal Bonds Sell.

Saskatoon, July 17.—Mayor Harrison, who has returned from a trip to Chicago, has announced that he has a tentative offer from Chicago bankers for \$500,000 worth of Saskatoon municipal bonds, with an option upon a further issue to the extent of \$418,000.
