### WHERE IT PAYS TO HAVE BIG FAMILIES

French Government Votes Subsidy of \$10,000,000 to Increase Birth Rate

Paris, July 19.—A bill providing for an interesting project of social reform, which was amended in the French Senate, passed the Chamber of Deputies. Its purpose is to endow large families in France, with a view of checking the decline in the birth rate.

Next year, when the act comes into operation, needy French parents with more than three children below the age of 13 may receive from a municipal authority an annual grant varying from \$12 to \$18 for each child beyond that number. In the case of a widower, the grant will apply to children less than 13 years of age beyond the number of two. A widow may claim the grant for any children below that age beyond one.

The law will entail an expenditure of \$10,000,000 a year, to be shared by the state, the departments and the municipalities.

### INFLUX OF AMERICAN CAPITAL TO DOMINION

(Continued from page 1)

\$25,000,000 in investments in lumber and mines in the prairie provinces; \$10,000,000 in packing plants; \$6,000,000 in agricultural implements distributing houses; \$8,575,000 in land deals in British Columbia; \$8,500,000 in municipal bonds sold privately; \$27,000,000 in investment in Canada of United States insurance companies; \$43,293,221 in miscellaneous industrial investments; \$10,000,000 in purchase of town and city property; \$15,525,000 in investments in the Maritime provinces.

According to officials whose statements are borne out by reports from United States consuls in Canada, the high rates of the Canadian tariff have apparently caused many a manufacturing establishment to establish branches of their industries in the Dominion. One report, which brings out this idea, was written by the United States consul at Owen Sound, who said:

"Prior to the present protective policy of Canada, American firms made the goods at home and shipped their finished products here. In order to hold this business it became necessary to establish American annexes here and manufacture the articles which they desire to sell to Canada."
