Referring to the speeches made before the meeting of the Liberal Association on Friday. the Journal said that it might be gathered from them that "old things as far as the party was concerned had passed away and all things had benew." Nevertheless. says the Journal, the province will not likely be "misled by the new dodges of the Liberal party." The party is described as merely an opposition, longing for power at any price and therefore seeing wrong in whatever is done by the Mc-Bride government.

In reply to all this it might be suggested that every great body becomes from time to time in need of reorganization if it is to avoid putrefaction. The Liberals preferred to reorganize, the Conservatives prefer to putrefy. Reorganization is, indeed, one of the best means of increasing the life and activity of a party. Owing to it the Liberal party is now as youthful and vigorous as the Conservative party is moribund.
