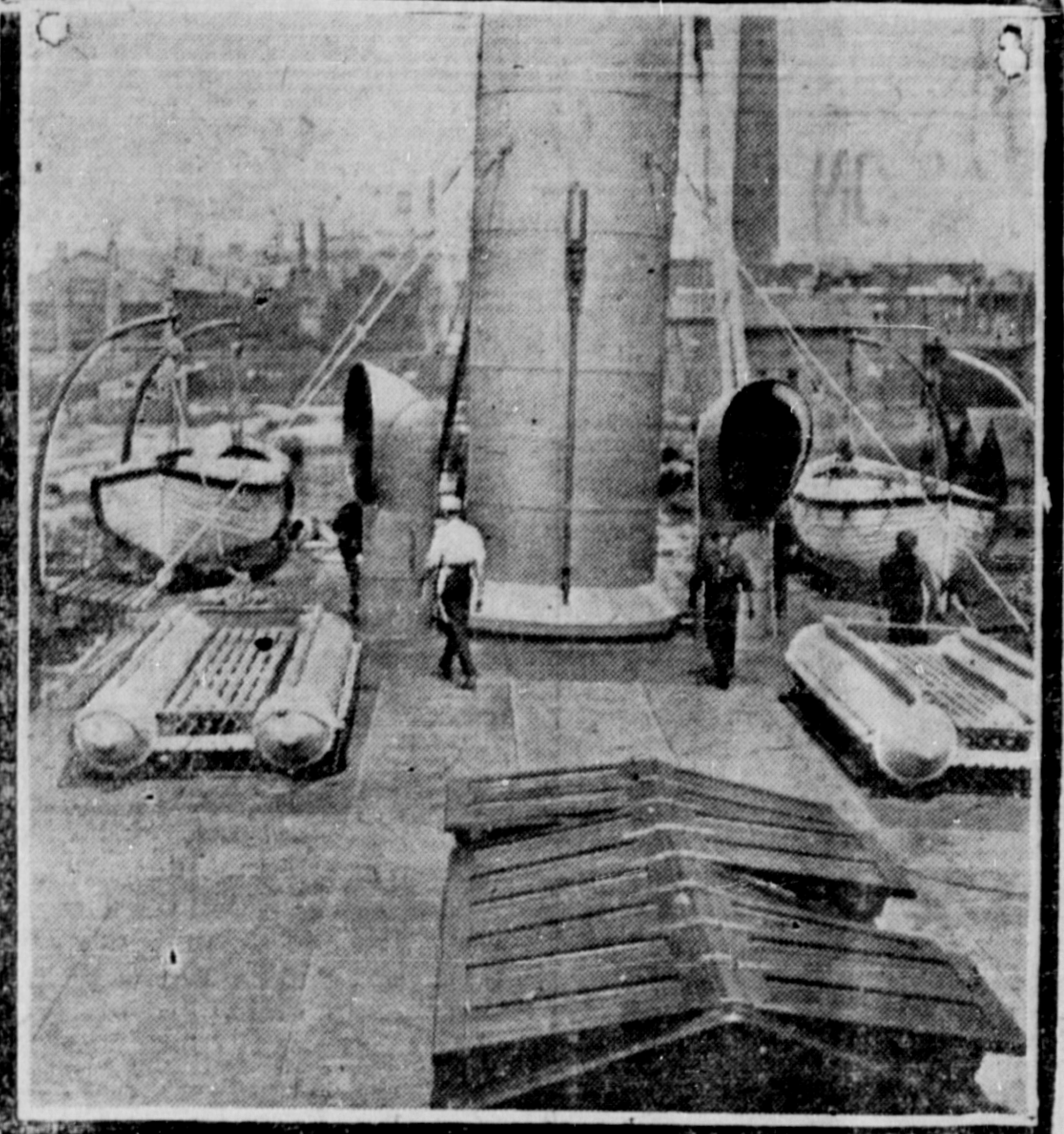


TO MAKE THE PORTS OF CANADA'S THIRD OCEAN NAVIGABLE

This application Permit No. 107
 is made by FORT EDWARD TOWNSHIP COM-
 PANY, LTD., a duly incorporated com-
 pany, requesting the granting of per-
 mission to the said FORT EDWARD TOWNSHIP COM-
 PANY, LTD., to excavate and the ex-
 ecution of the works for diversion
 to cubic feet per second from said
 watercourse, and to construct the
 plans and particulars required by
 one of Section 70 of the "Water
 Rights Act" now on file with the
 Controller of Water Rights at Victoria
 with the Water Recorder at Prince
 Rupert.

The completion of the government dredge "Port Nelson" at Toronto, and its journey around Labrador to Hudson and James bays, makes an epoch in the history of Canada. This dredge is the very latest in this class of vessel. It is fitted with all kinds of steam and electrical appliances, is commodious and very comfortable for the thirty men of the crew. On arrival at Port Nelson, where railways now building from east and west will have a terminus, the dredge will at once get to work dredging channels so that full sized ocean steamers can reach the port and carry away a big part of Canada's grain crop to England and the continent.
