



The completion of the government dredge "Port Nelson" at Toronto, and its journey around Labrador to Hudson and James bays, makes an epoch in the history of Canada. This dredge is the very latest in this class of vessel. It is fitted with all kinds of steam and electrical appliances, is commodious and very comfortable for the thirty men of the crew. On arrival at Port Nelson, where railways now building from east and west will have a terminus, the dredge will at once get te work dredging channels so that full sized ocean steamers can reach the port and carry away a big part of Canada's grain crop to England and the continent.
