Lingies street ary of State, is soon to Mr. L. T. Marechal, a wellknown Montreal lawyer. It is stated further that the discredited Secretary of State is to be appointed to the bench.

> Hon. Louis Coderre was brought into the Borden Government on October 30 last, to replace Hon. F. D. Monk, who had to resign because he could not honorably stay with a government whose course was in direct opposition to the platform on which he was elected. Although Mr. Coderre had also been elected on the Nationalist platform he swallowed the ministerial bait and accepted office. Then he went back for re-election in Hochelaga on November 19th and was returned against the Labor candidate, the Liberals refusing to oppose him.

> Immediately after his election, however, ugly rumors became rife that an elaborate scheme of impersonation had been carried on to gain Mr. Coderre's success. On March 17th last, Mr. L. J. Gauthier, M.P. for St. Hyacinthe, from his seat in parliament presented a full statement of the case with affidavits of several men to show they had been employed by Hon. Mr. Coderre for personation purposes and had conducted and organized impersonations at his election. Mr. Gauthier also showed that after the election one of these men had been given a government job, and others had been paid sums of money by Mr. Co-

Hon. Mr. Coderre contented himself with a blank denial of the charges and declared that the whole thing was a blackmailing scheme. This was

quite sufficient to satisfy Premier Borden-although he is supposed to be a lawyer of parts - and he immediately called upon his followers to whitewash Hon. Mr. Coderre, and they did so with the same unanimity that they exhibited before in whitewashing Hon. Mr. Rogers in the Macdonald by-election scandal.

Mr. Coderre was promptly challenged to take criminal proceedings against the men he had accused of perjury and blackmail, but although four months have elapsed since then, nothing has been done. It appears that the evidence which so easily satisfied the partisan group behind Mr Borden would not suffice in a court of law and Hon. Mr. Coderre is afraid to face a judge.

This man, elected to parliament, first obtained office by recanting the principles on which he was elected, then when accused of securing re-election by a criminal conspiracy, has so failed to vindicate his honor before the courts that he will probably be compelled to resign office. Can the people of Canada tolerate that such a man should be appointed as a judge on the bench which he fears to face on matters of criminal charges against himself?
