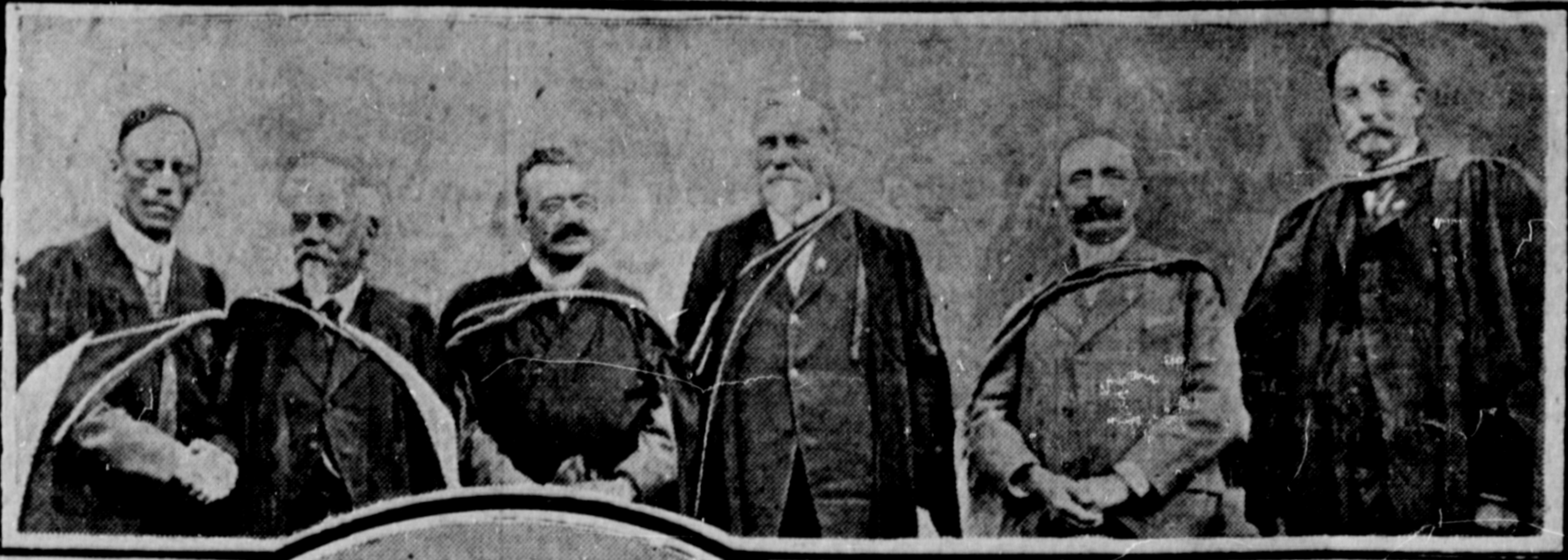

SINGLE NATURALIZATION LAW FOR THE EMPIRE IS DRAFTED

AGREEMENT IS AT LAST REACHED BETWEEN BRITISH AND CANADIAN GOVERNMENTS FIXING ONE LAW FOR EMPIRE.

Ottawa, Aug. 25.—An agreement between the British and Canadian authorities has at last been reached on the difficult and vexatious problem of imperial naturalization, over which there has been negotiation for years. Legislation which is agreeable to both the Asquith and the Borden governments has at last been carried and has received the approval of the two ministers. All that remains now is for concurrent legislation in the British and Canadian houses. Hon. Mr. Doherty has returned to England a copy of the proposed legislation which has been approved by the Canadian authorities. In all probability the bill will be introduced in the British house next session and will be passed here at the same time. Canadian legislation will be necessary, as the passing of the measure through the imperial house will not be effective in Canada.

Sherbrooke, Que., Aug. 20.—Through the courtesy of Governor LaForce of the Sherbrooke jail, where Thaw is confined, representatives of the press obtained a few moments' conversation with the famous prisoner last evening. Thaw at the time was excitedly pacing up and down his enforced quarters in the hospital ward of the jail when word was sent up to him that several newspaper men wanted to see him. At that time no orders had been given not to allow anybody to see Thaw, and he gladly descended to the governor's office.

Senator Jones Would Set Aside Space for Statues for Women Only

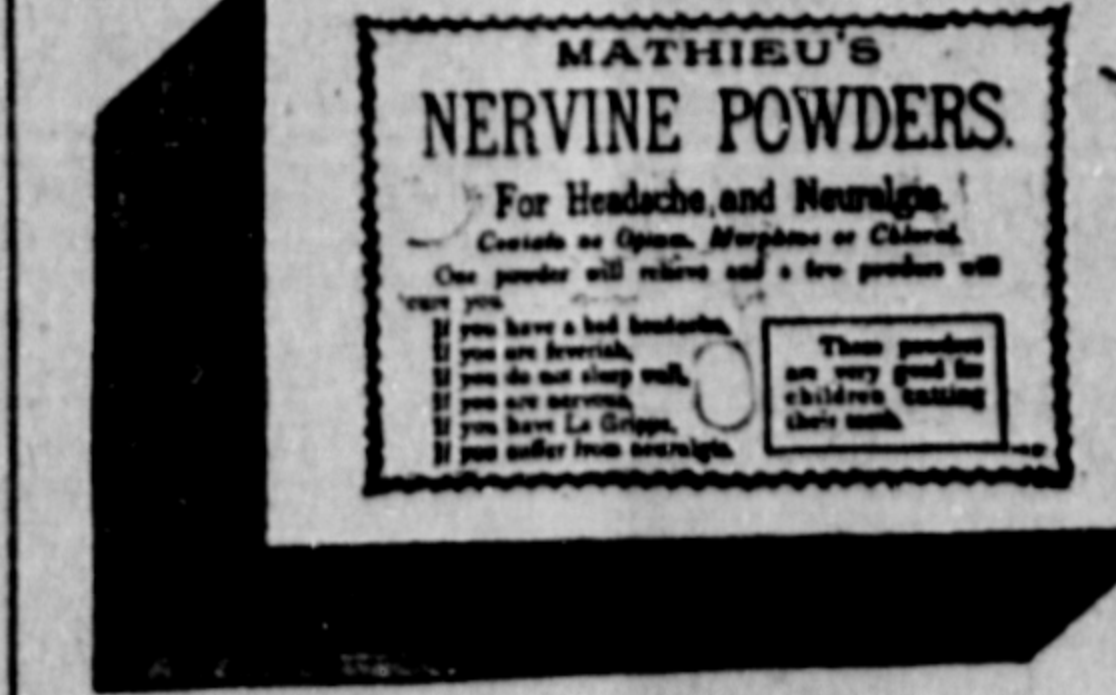

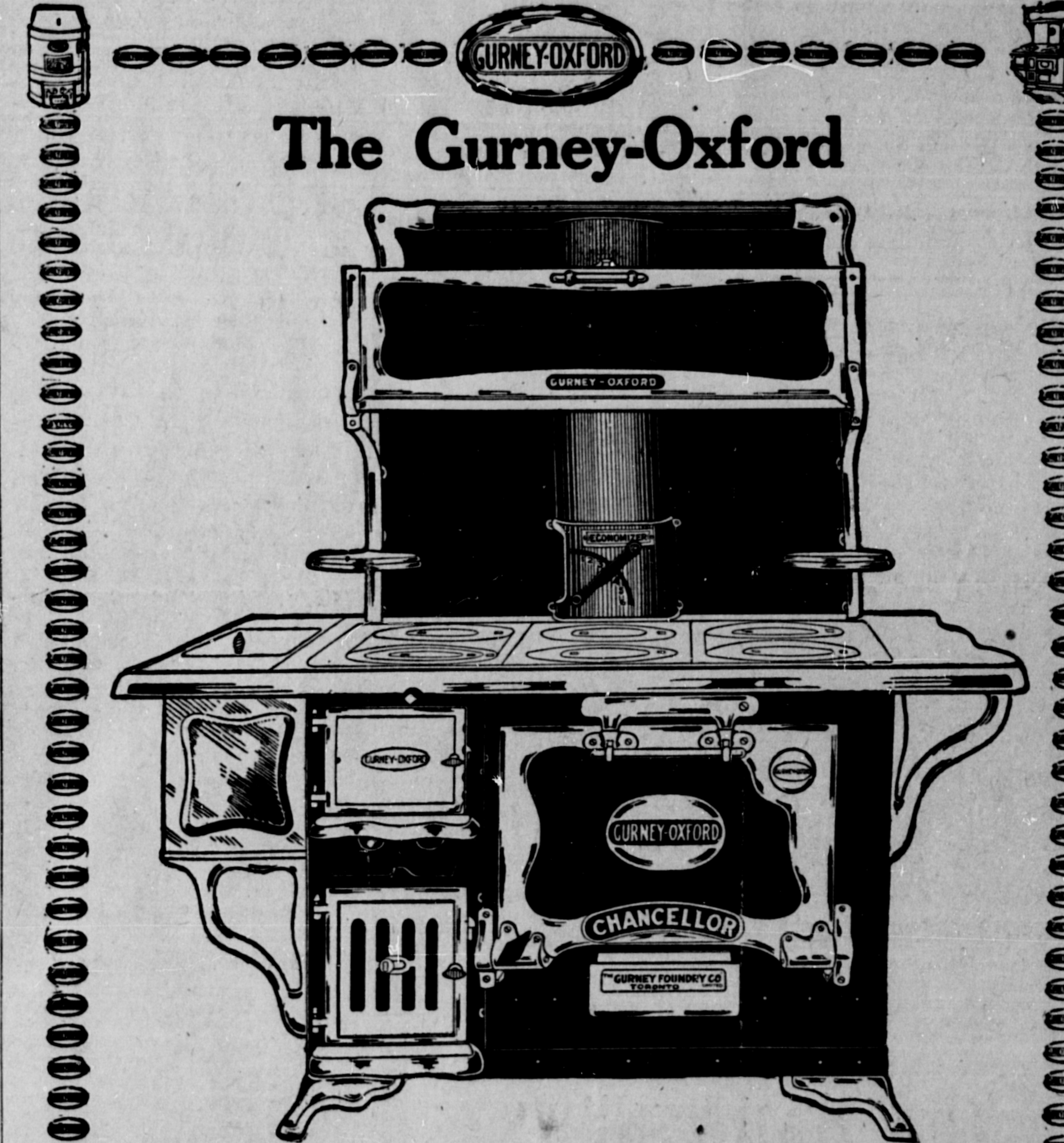
