HOT SPRINGS NEARLY DESTROYED BY FIRE

Damages Are Estimated at Over a Million and a Half Dollars in Buildings.

(Special to The Daily News) Hot Springs, Ark., Sept. 6 .-At 8 o'clock last night thirty blocks of buildings, including the city lighting plant and the court house, had been totally destroyet by fire. The fire started in the afternoon in the outskirts, and although fought with great vigor was not got under control before it shifted to the main business section of the city. Block after block was attacked by the flames and demolished, the total loss being estimated at over a million and a half dollars.
