THAW EPISODE NOT FLATTERING

So far as Canada is concerned the Thaw incident may be said to be closed, and it is not! likely that the fugitive will again seek sanctuary on this side of the line, and the talk of his lawyers as to what they will do to the Canadian immigration officials sounds like piffle. The Thaw incident is ended but i cannot be said to have added to anyone respect for the administration of justice in the Dominion. It cannot even be compared with that of the United States.

The rushing of Thaw out of the immigration pen by immigration officers at Coaticook and the carrying of him across the boundary line, without further explanation than that they were acting under the orders of the Minister of Justice, was a move by the immigration officials that was scarcely regular and not spectacular. It simply meant that a number of big, strong immigration officers bore down upon a miserable fellow mortal of insignificant physique and rushed him back to the soil from which he had come. The manner of his going compares but ill with the manner of his coming. He, at least, made a dash for liberty: the immigrationauthorities merely ran away with a knotty problem.



SUBSTITUTE FOUND FOR COAL GASOLINE

British Committee of Investigation Discovers Product Good for Motor Fuel.

London, Sept. 8 .- The joint committee appointed by the Royal Automobile Club, the Automobile Association and the Society of Motor Manufacturers to find an efficient substitute for gasoline has discovered a process which, it is said, will produce 40,000,000 gallons of motor spirit annually without in any way deflecting the country's mineral resources. It involves the utilization of a byproduct of coal, hitherto unsuitable for motor fuel.

Experts have made a full investigation, with excellent results, and a full sized commercial plant is being built. The spirit ARE YOU GOING EAST can be sold for not more than 28 cents a gallon, probably for less.

The secretary of the committee shows that the annual consumption of motor spirit in Great Britain is about 100,000,000 gallons, and that the present price of gasoline is 42 cents gallon.


