LOCAL NEWS ITEMS.

Miss Blanchet of Vancouver arrived in the city yesterday, en route to Masset to visit her mother, Mrs. Charles M. Wilson.

The case of Gilmour vs. McCoskrie, which has been occupying the attention of Judge Young's court for the past two days, was on again this morning.

James Haney, colored, charged with supplying liquor to Port Simpson Indians, was acquitted this morning by Magistrate Carrs.

Nick Gurvich, for breach of the street bylaw, was fined \$2 by Magistrate Carrs this morning. The offence was that he left cordwood on the street for longer than two hours.

A score or more of Stewartites who were in the city for the Fair returned to the Portland Canal mining town by the Prince George this morning. Among the number were T. J. Vaughn-Rhys and W. J. Crawford.

The steamer Spokane arrived in port this morning about 9:30. Among those taking passage from here were C. J. Lund and Edgar Jump. The steamer had on board 18,000 cases of salmon from Alaskan canneries for Seattle.

BASKET BALL LEAGUE TO BE ORGANIZED

Rush of Gold to Seattle.

Seattle, Sept. 29.—The United States assay office in Seattle on Wednesday recorded its largest day's gold receipts of the season, with the total of \$401,262. Of this \$319,676 was from Nome, \$61,586 from Iditarod, \$20,000 from Koyukuk and \$10,000 from Fairbanks. With yesterday's receipts the total for the month of September 24 is \$1,613,754.65. In July, August and September, 1912, the assay office received \$1,934,596.92 in gold. During the same months of 1913 the assay office received \$4,463,935.10, or approximately a \$2,000,000 increase.

LEAD CLAIMS BONDED BY VANCOUVER MEN

Peerless Group of Seven Claims on O. K. Mountain Is Taken Over.

Vancouver, Sept. 29.—After spending several months in the Hazelton district, Captain H. M. St. Cyr has returned to Vancouver, having secured a bond and lease on the Peerless group of seven claims, which are located on O. K. Mountain, eighteen miles east of Kitlas. He brought down a large quantity of ore specimens from the property.

The Peerless group was located by Alonzo Hamblett, Eli T. Hamblett and James D. Wells, who have done a large amount of surface work, exposing the lead for 755 feet. In that distance it is said to average thirty-two feet in width, and assays have been taken across seventeen feet, which show 12 1/2 per cent. copper, 1 1/4 ounces in gold and 14 ounces in silver. The ore is principally bornite and grey copper.

Under the terms of the bond, which is for \$30,000, continuous work must be done, and Captain St. Cyr expects to have a crew of probably twenty-five men operating all winter. The property is at present reached by trail, but a wagon road has been promised by the government. The lead lies above a very steep bluff, and a depth of 900 feet can be obtained by running a short crosscut tunnel, which will be the first development work undertaken.

PROHIBITIVE INSURANCE RATES MAY BE ADJUSTED

A Thorough Investigation Is Now Being Made by Special Representatives of Underwriters.

A great deal of credit is due to C. W. Peck, of Peck, Moore & Co., and M. J. Hobin, manager of the Continental Trust Co., for their efforts in endeavoring to secure lower insurance rates for the city of Prince Rupert. These two gentlemen, with the assistance of some others, have for some time been most aggressive in this matter and as a result some definite action is now being taken toward the desired end.

F. Seeley, assistant to A. W. Ross, head of the coast underwriters, arrived in the city yesterday for the purpose of making a thorough investigation of the conditions. He will remain here for some three or four weeks, during which he will make a new survey of the city for fire insurance purposes.

One of the first steps made in his investigation was a trial of the fire department yesterday afternoon. About 4:15 an alarm was turned in from Box 17, at the Central Hotel, to which the brigade responded most promptly. Within two minutes from the time the alarm was given Chief McDonald and his men were on hand with 450 feet of hose laid and the water turned on. Mr. Seeley was highly pleased with the test, which was as good as would be done in any of the cities.

The insurance rates in Prince Rupert have been almost prohibitive and not at all in accordance with the efficiency of the fire department, the water pressure and conditions generally. The visit of Mr. Seeley and the efforts of the men who have been the means of getting him here are therefore of the utmost importance to all property owners.

CUSTOMS RETURNS SHOW BIG INCREASE

Imports at Prince Rupert for September 50 Per Cent. More Than Last Year.

The steady increase in collections from dutiable goods at the port of Prince Rupert is positive proof of the rapid development and settlement of the northern part of the province, for which Prince Rupert is the distributing centre. The collections for September of this year amounted to \$23,555.29, as against \$14,104.47 last September. This shows an increase of over 50 per cent. in one year. The collections for August were \$2,000 higher than last year.
