## THAT CENTENARY OF PEACE.

Not much interest is shown in this city in the coming celebration of peace between Great Britain and the United States, beyond the fact that a memorial arch is to be built at Blaine connecting this province with one of the states. The intention of the peace centenary is to celebrate the fact that there has been peace throughout a century that has passed, during the greater part of which the majority of the celebrants were not yet alive and could, therefore, not have been in any way responsible. If the peace celebration had, as an object of its rejoicng, a pact between the two countries to refrain from war for the century that is to come the occasion for the celebration would be much more tangible.

In the celebration which is being arranged, soldiers of both countries are to take prominent part. This is on a par with the position of Andrew Carnegie, who builds a peace palace out of the profits derived from the manufacture of armor plate. In the celebration which should be arranged soldiers would have no part, because the practise of soldiery would have ceased to have a reason, and there would be no more occasion for men to be soldiers.
