

Mr. Shockley suggested that a notice be put up in the reading room asking for suggestions as to subjects desired. On request of the meeting he was authorized to look after this.

Mayor Pattullo named as a committee to formulate plans Messrs. Kerr, Shockley, Black, Shaw, Rogers and Godson.

The meeting then adjourned, the committee remaining to discuss the question.

The following list of subjects panied him. for tuition was proposed:

Elementary English, arithmetic and spelling, geometrical drawing, machine construction and drawing, arithmetic and mensurlation, stenography and typewriting, building construction, electricity, steam, mechanics, sound, light and heat, navigation.

It is requested by the committee that all those wishing to take up any of these studies will notify the secretary, W. Godson, on or before Saturday next, stating the particular subject or subjects which they desire tuition. must be understood that upon the number of students who at once enroll depends the success of the undertaking. If a sufficient number enroll a class in steam engineering will be started, from which students may take an examination for the B. C. stationary engineer certificates.
