

It was spent quietly at his home here but during the afternoon he had many callers and the simple courtesy developed into a crowded reception. Most of the leaders and many of the rank and file of both sides in politics were present and telegrams and cablegrams were making long distance calls all the afternoon. King George wired his hearty congratulations, as did Premier Asquith, Lloyd George, Bonar Law, Lord Strathcona, Earl Grey and numerous other prominent men of Britain. Senator G. R. Pearse, ex-Minister of State and ex-Premier Fisher of Australia, cabled their congratulations, as did also Premier Massey of New Zealand.
