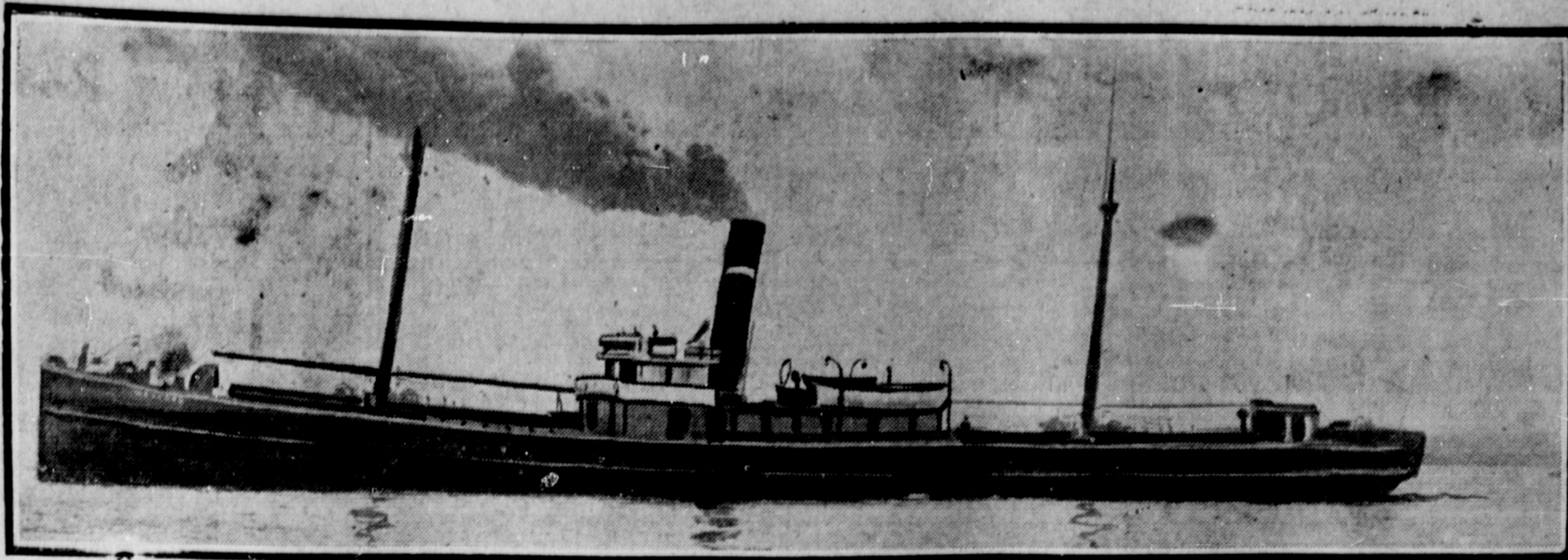

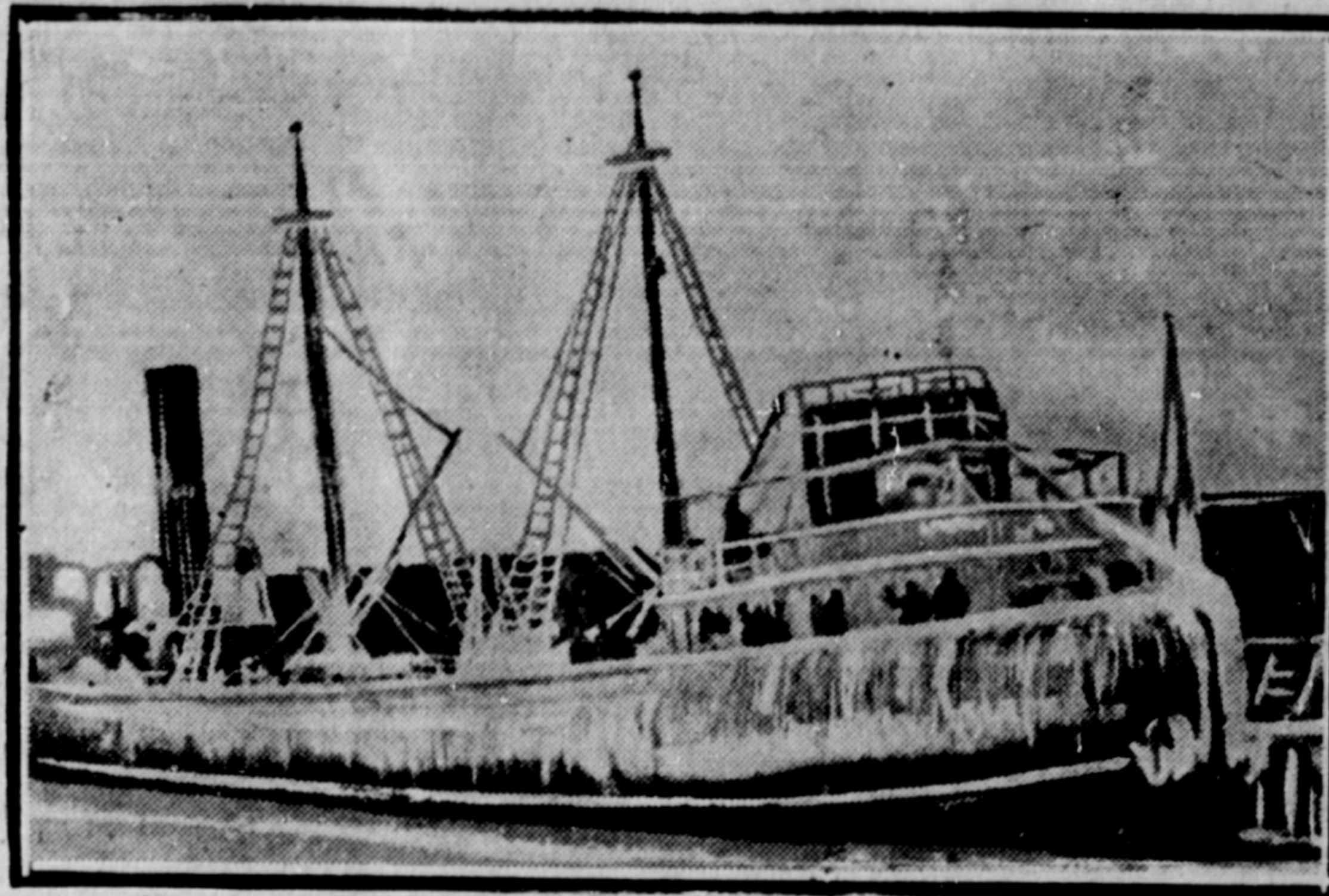
## THE OTHER SIDE OF MEXICO'S CASE STATED BY LANE WILSON

CONTENDS THAT TROUBLES WOULD HAVE ENDED HAD NOT UNITED STATES REFUSED TO RECOGNIZE HUERTA, WHO WAS LEGALLY ELECTED.

Washington, Nov. 25.—Before an audience which filled the Belasco Theatre tonight, Henry Lane Wilson, former ambassador to Mexico, compared the diplomacy of the administration to "a Mother Hubbard which covers everything and touches nothing." "We are now committed to a policy in the Mexican situation which will lead to humiliation or require us to play schoolmaster to every unruly republic between the Rio Grande and Cape Horn," said Mr. Wilson.

Since the announcement that the former ambassador planned a series of lectures on the Mexican situation there has been an unusual official interest displayed.

In the audience tonight, which frequently applauded, were diplomatic representatives of every Latin-American government. Mr. Wilson's version of the events which led up to the establishment of the Huerta government and his statement that peace would have been restored had the United States recognized the provisional government three months ago were received with applause. "The government of Huerta," he said, "was as legally established as the government of Theodore Roosevelt after the assassination of McKinley. Every step taken was in accordance with the constitutional provisions of that unhappy country."



SAFE IN THE HARBOR, BUT A BIT FROSTED

One of the freighters which was reported as missing, arriving in the harbor at Sarnia, Ont. The vessel is covered with ice and the captain reported that for days she had a fierce battle with the wind and waves.

## WORK ON BIG WINGDAM

With a crew of twenty men and three teams, Foreman Dan McPhee is hard at work on the 1,000 foot wingdam about a mile above the big bridge crossing the Bear river. The harnessing of the scores of glacial streams within his district is by no means the least of the many problems facing Road Superintendent C. J. Gillingham, and Bear river especially, swollen as it has been by the exceptionally heavy rainfall during the past season, has wrought havoc not only with the main bridge, portions of which it has washed out on two separate occasions, but acres of good land have been inundated. But for the present timely intervention of the Provincial government the main artery of this watershed threatened to change its entire course, and it is hard to estimate the amount of damage had it been allowed to do so.

The purpose of the new wingdam is to force the river back into its original channel and to check the inroads it has made this summer. It will also protect the graveyard from submersion. The work, which of necessity must be performed when the water is at its lowest, will be rushed with the view of having it finished before the heavy snowfall renders work practically impossible.—Portland Canal Miner.

## Latest of the Zeppelins.

Friedrichshafen, Germany, Nov. 25.—The latest of the Zeppelin war airships, the Zeppelin VI, ascended from Lake Constance today and started on its first trip, a 250 mile flight to Gotha. The big dirigible is intended for service in the German army.

## PORTLAND CANAL MINING

L. L. & H.—Rumor says that a deal is pending whereby the owners, J. Lydden, J. Lade and J. Hartley, may dispose of this valuable property at a good round figure. The L. L. & H. group is situated on Bitter Creek, about eight miles from the confluence of that creek with Bear River. The London Venture Company through the medium of a Mr. Hoffman endeavored to secure this property in the fall of 1910, since which time two tunnels have been driven and the vein crosscut in both cases. The ore carries good values in both gold and silver and the consensus of the opinion of those who know is that as soon as the right people get hold of the property it will quickly be added to the list of shippers.

Swamp Point.—A force of 35 men is now engaged on the Grandby Company's property at Swamp Point. These claims were purchased by the company last summer from Hartley & Moulton and the lime therefrom is to serve as a flux for the Hidden Creek ore. The rock is to be extracted by the glory hole process and it is estimated that it can be placed in the bunkers at the smelters at a cost of 50 cents per ton. Two tunnels have already been driven, from which raises will be put up to the surface. A first class wharf has been constructed and everything should be in shape to ship in the immediate future.—Portland Canal Miner.
