THE DOUBLE STANDARD POWER

Rev. F. W. Kerr has become famous for propounding theories that are both startling and convincing. In his sermon on Sunday night he had the courage to handle a subject that statesmen will only mention beneath their breath, "Shall Britain Retain the Double Standard Power?" In support of that proposition the people of Great Britain stand bleed themselves white and the Dominions themselves bid fair to become a partner in the mad fight.

Why? The Germans are the only people who seem to challenge that supremacy and we have their reiterated assurances that their policy is entirely for defence. Possibly indeed they would like to get a slice of the rich lands that are now inhabitated by barbarians. And if they did would it not be a good thing all around. Why should not the Germans get a slice of pie, even if they have arrived at the cook-house door a little late.

From what we see of the Germans we know them to be men of industry. They are not a warlike people. War is destructive and the leading idea of the German is constructive. Should they want expansion; and power they are likely to seek that in the line of least resistance and not in a conflict with a powerful nation like Britain.

Let us look at the case in the light of British history. What about the victories of Drake. of Nelson, of Wellington? Were they fought with the advantage! of the double standard power? They certainly were not. There were times indeed, when Britons fought single handed, and successfully, the whole forces of Europe and that without an advantage of numbers. 
