Sam Newton was always known to be a quitter. Never in his whole public life has he come out into the open and played the game like a man. Not only does he refuse to meet his opponents on the level, but he will even forsake his friends in a pinch. He did this a year ago when the contest got too hot for him. The arguments of his opponents had so "muddled" him that he threw up his hands in despair and only after the most desperate urging was he induced to re-enter the lists.

Today he has again shown the white feather. He was personally invited by the mayor to be present at the meeting last night, but remembering his experience of last year he decided to decline. In other words he will not allow the arguments of his opponents to "muddle" him again. He will endeavor to persistently hold to his one idea, for if he lost that he might never get another.

Now this is not the kind of a man who should aspire to high office. That position requires a clear head, a broad knowledge and a persistence

that can neither be rattled nor dismayed.

Mayor Pattullo presented his case last night in a masterly way. He knew his subject and confidence was written in every move. Knowing both men, it is not to be wondered that the ex-mayor refused to appear. Had he been there he would certainly have received the greatest intellectual thrashing ever dealt out to any man.

A half dozen meetings such as that last night would revolutionize the most antagonistic atmosphere. The tirade of abuse carried on by Mr. Newton could not help influencing many voters who had no other source of knowledge. Time after time, however, were the pins knocked from under their opponents by both the mayor and Mr. Naden, and a blind man could see the readjustment of public opinion. The crowd as a rule is fair, particularly when they find the man whom they thought was a hero is a coward and a knave. Mr. Newton has proved himself a coward in that he refused to meet his opponents on the public platform, and a knave because he made statements and insinuations he could not substantiate.
