Seward, Alaska, Feb. 6.—Coarse gold has been found on Chicamun creek, in the Nelchina district, say the latest reports received from that section. The find was made at a depth of twenty-two feet. Considerable quartz wash carrying free gold was picked up in the sediment. Knik is excited over the latest report, and many are preparing to join the stampede. Five hundred men are now in the diggings. Three parties will leave Seward tomorrow with dog teams. The Seward Chamber of Commerce plans to spend money enough to put the trail at the head of Turnagain arm in good condition for the mushers. With the exception of dog feed there is an abundance of supplies at Knik.

**MOTHER'S PENSION LAW TO BE BOOMERANG**

United Charities of Chicago Find Families Having Funds Insist on State Aid

Chicago, Feb. 6.—Charges that the mothers' pension law of Illinois, by which mothers at the head of indigent families are given state aid, is proving something of a boomerang was made in a report of the United Charities of this city.

"Since the passing of this law," says the report, "families having members and connections with resources that would tide them over emergencies decline to use them and insistently claim their share of state aid, thus weakening the moral fibre and making it difficult for private charities to induce relatives to help their kin."

The report states that desertion of their families by husbands has increased alarmingly.
