Will Be Put Into Commission on February 15—Can Be Seen Twenty-four Miles

The new lighthouse at Cape St. James off the Queen Charlotte Islands has been completed and will be put into commission on February 15. The light tower is built on solid concrete. The lantern is a third-order, being a powerful light which can be seen 24 miles at sea.

The lighthouse has been under construction for the past year. The work has been difficult and stormy weather caused much delay at times.

The new lightkeeper will be Taylor Ash, who is now in charge.

SALMON STATISTICS FOR PAST SEASON

Show Big Year on Whole Coast—Puget Sound Made a Record Catch

The salmon canneries of British Columbia packed 1,353,901 cases, valued at \$8,803,213, during 1913, according to the statistics published by Mr. Miller Freeman in his year book on Pacific coast fishing. The industry on this coast showed an increase of over two million cases over the 1912 pack. This was due in a large measure to the unusually large pack of sockeyes on Puget Sound, which showed an increase of 575,195 cases over the pack of 1909, the previous big run. Here are the figures of last year's pack:
