Pressure Being Brought to Bear to Extend Term—Depends on Health of Duchess

(Special to The Daily News.) Ottawa, Feb. 9.—Though the term of the Duke of Connaught as governor-general is supposed to expire in October next, there is a strong probability of the term being extended another year, particularly if the health of the duchess continues to be good. Pressure is being brought to bear to gain the consent of the duke to remain in Canada for a longer period, and it is believed that these had weight, although no announcement is made regarding the matter.
