There is a provincial government advertisement running in the morning paper of very particular interest to the people of Prince Rupert. W. R. Ross, minister of lands, gives notice that the reserve couver? of water of Kaien Island and the Tsimpsean peninsula made

in 1910 has been cancelled. This is a matter of vital moment to the city. Last year the government was requested by the council to reserve permanently for the use of future additions to the city all the waters adjacent to the city likely to be required by the city at a future date. Especial stress was laid upon the necessity of permanently reserving the water known as Mc-Nicholl Creek across the harbor, and the waters of Cloyah River.

McNicholl Creek will have to be the source of water supply for the future town across the harbor and Cloyah River will be required to supply the town on the back of the island.

Enquiry was made at the city hall as to whether the government had signified its intention of making the reserves asked for last year, but no reply has been received by the city respecting the permanent reserves asked for. Meantime we are confronted with the notice of cancellation of reserves as per advertisement now running in the morning paper.


