STEAMER'S LIFEBELT HAD WONDERFUL DRIFT

Picked Up Off Prince of Wales Island-Travelled Forty Miles a Day

Vancouver, March 10.-As evidence of the strong tidal currents which prevail in the north Pacific, an instance is given by C. O. Julian, who returned Saturday from the north, of the wonderful drift of a life belt which was lost from the C. P. R. liner Empres of Russia about 800 miles out of Yokohama.

This belt was picked up inside of Cape Chacon, Prince of Wales Island, and is now on exhibition in Ketchikan. Investigation by the officials of the Canadian Pacific railway proved that, allowing for the buoy being picked up on the day reported, it travelled on an average of 40 miles per
