Ottawa, April 11.-An orderin-council has been passed providing that the order of March 7 in regard to fisheries license fees for salmon fishing in British Columbia shall not come into! effect until January 1, 1915. The order recites that Sir Richard McBride has interviewed th minister of marine on the subject and has requested that federal license fees be not raised for the present year, in order that time may be allowed to reach some amicable arrange- || ment between the two governments in regard to the whole matter of administration of fish-

eries in British Columbia. The British Columbia Fishing & Packing company, limited, of Vancouver, has been federally incorporated with a capital stock f \$5,000 000. The incorporaors are nominally given as clerks in a Toronto legal office usually associated with Mackenzie & Mann enterprises.
