## IRISH SITUATION MORE CRITICAL THAN EVER

J. Devlin Says the Irish Will Not Concede Anything More

Belfast, April 15.—An independent critic would have said yesterday that a solution of the home rule situation was near at hand. Today one would emphatically predict that the situation in Ulster is more critical than ever.

Joseph Devlin, in a speech today, bade defiance to any solution that excluded from Ireland's own sphere one section of the country. The situation at Belfast was replete with danger to one who knows both sides, he said. Those who live in Belfast in the heart of the Carsonian movement know how great a sham, fraud and humbug has been subsidized and arranged at enormous cost to bluff the British people into defeating home rule in parliament. The act will be placed on the book. The Irish cannot and will not advance one inch further toward conciliation.

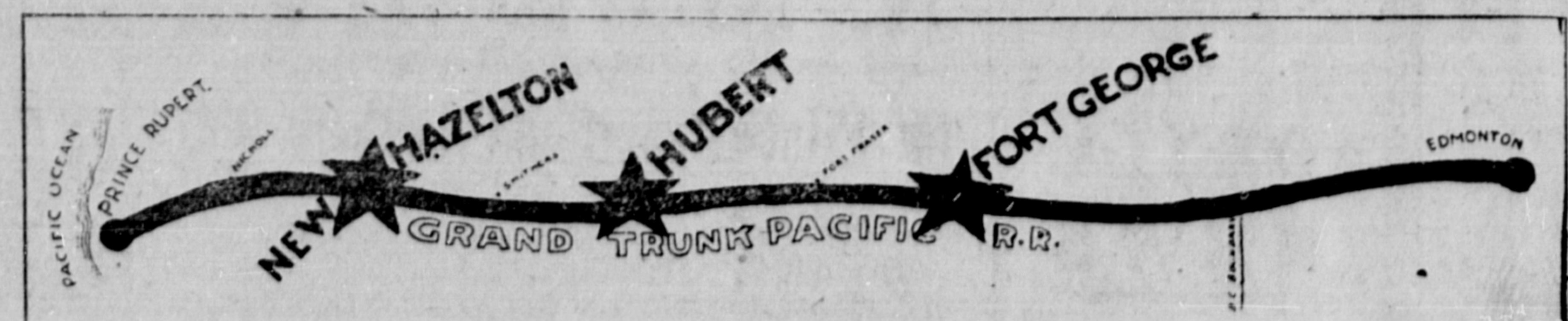
