The St. Andrew's and Caledonian Society of British Columbia has arranged to hold its annual athletic sports, under the sanction of the B. C. A. A. U., at


bout for the Canadian lightweight championship between Johnny O'Leary of Seattle and Frenchy Vaise of Renton, indefinitely.
