Prince Rupert will welcome today a very distinguished party. The most worshipful Grand Lodge of Ancient and Accepted Masons of British Columbia will convene here from Wednesday till Friday night of this week. This institution is not

only more ancient than the golden fleece and more honorable than the star or garter but it also contains within its ranks most of the leading men in every community where it is established. At the same time it is not an exclusive body. In this Province it contains all grades of society from the Premier to the humblest tiller of the soil.



The black dots represent Government owned and operated wireless stations under the station name, shows the stations operated by the Marconi Company. The "N.M.'ne" and the dots with the rings range in nautical miles. The Gulf stations between Montreal and Port Riche are open permanently day and night during the season of navigation. 
