COLD STORAGE SPACE

Order-in-Council Adds Several New Clauses to the

Ottawa, July 7 .-- An order-incouncil has been passed adding several important new sections to the Dominion Cold Storage Act. It is provided that the owners and managers of cold storage warehouses shall give the public refrigerated space in such warehouses. It shall be deemed to be a violation of the regulations if the owner of the warehouse re fuses to receive goods from the public at the approved rate for storage, on the ground of lack of space, when any part of the space is occupied by goods which are the property of the owners of the warehouses.

Owners and managers must not contract or agree to give all the refrigerated space to one or more firms to the exclusion of the general public.
